#### MAY, 1953

A net daily average of 394,082 barrels of oil delivered out of Canadian pipe lines during the 31 days of May established another new record for deliveries, the previous high having been 369,900 barrels daily in April. In May of 1952, by comparison, daily deliveries were only 307,366 barrels. Thus volume in the current May increased 28.2 p.c. over that handled in the previous May. Greatly increased deliveries of crude in Saskatchewan, and intransit to Ontario via the Great Lakes, as well as that for refined oils in Ontario, contributed to the indicated

Met deliveries during the month totalled 12,216,543 barrels and inaugurated the first time that the 12 million barrel mark of deliveries has been achieved in any one month. This total was up 1,119,533 barrels from the April total of 11,097,010 and 2,688,199 barrels above the May, 1952 movement. Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario recorded increased net deliveries during May, a slight decline occurred in Quebec but Alberta was down over 25 p.c. Comparison of deliveries in the two periods follows (May, 1952 data in brackets): Alberta 992,009 (1,328,836); Saskatchewan 1,235,124 barrels (797,559); Manitoba 3,446,968 (3,064,186); Ontario 2,372,966 (146,382) and Quebec 4.169,476 barrels (4,191,381). Oil transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Co. and destined principally for Ontario ports is included in Manitoba deliveries. These deliveries amounted to 3,176,931 barrels in the current May compared with 2,532,734 in May, 1952.

Het receipts of oil for movement in Canadian pipe lines during May included 5,563,223 barrels of Alberta crude, 32,982 of Alberta natural gasoline, 29,240 of Manitoba crude, 4,210,833 of imported crude and 2,372,884 barrels of refined oils produced in Ontario and Quebec.

During the five months to May 31, 1953 a net total delivery of 55,115,802 barrels produced a 48.5 p.c. increase over the 37,126,068 barrels delivered in the corresponding period of 1952. Deliveries out of pipe lines in each province to the end of May were (1952 data in brackets): Alberta 5,950,245 barrels (6,008,369); Saskatchevan 5,602,506 (3,834,093); Manitoba 12,001,556 (8,285,439); Ontario 9,953,693 (244,768) and Quebec 21,607,802 barrels (18,753,399). Manitoba totals included 9,778,953 barrels (5,881,814) transferred to the United States sector of the Interprovincial Pipe Line and scheduled principally for delivery to Ontario points by lake tanker.

Gathering systems handled an average of 149,269 barrels per day during May, down some 678 barrels from the 149,947 per day in May, 1952. Trunk deliveries again established a new record at 433,176 barrels per day, some 66,656 above the daily 366,520 delivered during the previous May.

The average length of haul by trunk lines in May was 312.6 miles and traffic movement passed the 4 billion barrel miles mark for the first time at 4.2 billion. Trunk movement in the previous May totalled 3.2 billion barrel miles and the average distance a barrel of oil moved was 280 miles. Total traffic movement of nearly 16.2 billion barrel miles was achieved in the first five months of this year compared with some 10 billion in the like period of last year.

Persone employed in May numbered 920 and earned \$319,795, while the 668 persons employed in May of 1952 had earnings of \$228,658. Wage earners worked 47,865 hours in May versus 43,272 one year earlier.

In the five months ended May 31, 1953 the Montreal Pipe Line delivered a total of 21,607,802 barrels including 4,169,476 in the month reviewed. The Interprovincial Pipe Line delivered 149,739 barrels daily in May and performed a traffic movement of 3.2 billion barrel miles, both new records for the company. Imperial Pipe Line deliveries from the company's gathering system were an average 122,913 barrels per day during the month bringing the daily average for the year to date to 107,392 barrels.

> Operations of the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of 1952. Revenue and employee data for the pipe line are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the Anglo-Canadian Oils Limited pipe line in Manitoba have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been shown in all other applicable sections of the report. Trans-Northern Pipe Line Company made its first deliveries of refinery products to Ontario terminals in November, 1952. This line runs from Montreal to Hamilton with a spur serving Ottawa.
