# PIPF. LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

Oil delivered from Canadian pipe lines during October averaged 478,216 barrels per day compared with a daily average of 489,223 barrels in September and 416,939 in October last year, an increase of 14.6 p.c. over the 1953 figure.

Net receipts totalled 15,529,476 barrels, up 4 p.c. from September's receipts of 14,883,573 and 21 p.c. above October, 1953. Included in the October receipts were 7,530,532 barrels of Alberta crude, 51,799 of Alberta natural gasoline, 236,834 of Manitoba crude, 5,024,655 of imported crude and 2,685,656 barrels of refinery products.

Net deliveries of oil for the month of October amounted to 14,324,697 barrels as against 12,925,109 barrels in the corresponding month last year. For the ten months ended October 31, net deliveries amounted to 141,628,549 barrels compared with 119,985,808 in the same period last year, an increase of 18 p.c. Provincial totals for the ten-month period were as follows (1953 data in brackets): British Columbia, 11,158,737 barrels (267,064\*); Alberta, 13,597,923 (14,110,827); Saskatchewan, 11,735,616 (11,813,177); Manitoba, 34,576,115 (29,416,491); Ontario, 26,390,231 (20,223,614) and Quebec 44,169,927 (44,154,635). The British Columbia figure includes for the first time an export item of 281,657 barrels of crude destined to a refinery at Ferndale, Washington. Manitoba deliveries include 28,927,990 barrels (24, 328, 792) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company for transport through the United States. The bulk of this oil returns to Canada at Sarnia.

During October gathering systems handled an average of 200,757 barrels per day as against 216,076 barrels in September and 164,546 in October, 1953. Trunk lines averaged 598,494 barrels per day compared with 595,185 in September and 476,776 in October, 1953, an increase of 26 p.c. over the previous year. Barrel miles at 5,327 million were down from the previous month by 7 p.c. but 17 p.c. above last year. The average haul dropped from 319.2 in September to 287.1.

Employment fell off during October with 1,131 employees earning \$461,547 compared with 1,198 employees earning\$473,031 in the previous month. The average wage for the month at \$391 was below September's average of \$395 but 7 p.c. above the average of \$365 earned in October, 1953.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Froducts Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil. Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Co. in Alberta, Anglo Canadian Oils Ltd. in Manitoba and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company in Alberta have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report. Operating statistics of the Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Limited, carrying natural gasoline from the compression refrigeration plant at Devon to refineries at Edmonton are included in this report. Employee data are not available for this line.

With the completion of Interprovincial's extension to Sarnia, the Transit and Storage Company's line from Cygnet, Ohio, to Sarnia was no longer needed and this line was sold to the Suckeye Pipe Line Company in Movember, 1953. This company ceased making deliveries to Canada in January, 1954, leaving only two Lines operating across the St. Clair river from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their domestic operations and the shortness of these lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these pipe lines follows:
