

PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

Oil carried by Canadian pipe lines reached a new high in December with a net delivery of 513,714 barrels per day, compared with 484,182 barrels in November and 464,502 in December, 1953. Total net deliveries for the month amounted to 15,925,138 barrels, 10.5 p.c. above the 14,399,552 barrels delivered in the corresponding month last year.

For the twelve months ended December 31 net deliveries totalled 172,495,935 barrels compared with a total of 147,303,771 in 1953. Provincial totals for the year were as follows (1953 data in brackets): British Columbia, 14,566,334 barrels (1,540,011*); Alberta, 16,452,608 (16,984,749); Saskatchewan, 14,191,691 (14,189,654); Manitoba, 41,519,892 (36,682,639); Ontario, 32,441,988 (24,868,257) and Quebec, 53,323,422 (53,038,461). Manitoba deliveries included 34,776,583 barrels (30,524,131) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company for transport through the United States, principally to Sarnia refineries, and 6,743,309 (6,158,508) delivered within the province. Of Interprovincial's deliveries to the Lakehead line during the past year, 31,323,630 barrels had re-entered Canada at Sarnia by the end of the year.

Net receipts during December totalled 16,451,209 barrels compared with 14,766,793 in the same month of 1953. December receipts included 8,200,711 barrels of Alberta crude and 53,323 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 123,214 of Saskatchewan crude, 264,796 of Manitoba crude, 4,646,800 of imported crude and 3,162,365 barrels of refinery products.

Both gathering and trunk lines made record deliveries in December. Gathering lines handled an average of 223,093 barrels per day compared with 201,827 in November and 188,895 in December last year. Trunk lines handled 619,458 barrels per day, 6 p.c. above the November average of 581,196 barrels and almost 12 p.c. above December 1953. Barrel miles reached a new peak at 5,881 million and the average haul rose from 290.4 miles in November to 306.2.

Employment during December showed little change from the previous month but the average for the year at 1,185 was 25 p.c. above the 1953 average of 951. Earnings also were up by 31 p.c. from \$4,188,498 in 1953 to \$5,503,329.

Operating revenues for the last quarter of the year amounted to \$11,438,213, bringing the total for the year to \$41,765,773 compared with \$28,305,431 in 1953, an increase of almost 48 p.c.

The South Saskatchewan Pipe Line Company is included in this report for the first time and the November figures shown in this report have been revised to include its November operations. This company has a gathering system serving the Fosterton area of Saskatchewan with a terminal at Cantuar. The trunk line connects Cantuar with Regina, Saskatchewan, a distance of 155 miles. Oil first entered the trunk line on November 5, 1954. The Green River Exploration Company also appears for the first time in this report.

This company commenced operations in December with two parallel lines carrying absorption plant products from Bonnie Glen to loading facilities at Calmar, Alberta.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, and Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

Net totals given in Table 6 exceed those in Tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting from intercompany transfers of oil. These differences are accounted for in the following table.

With the completion of Interprovincial's extension to Sarnia, the Transit and Storage Company's line from Cygnet, Ohio, to Sarnia was no longer needed and this line was sold to the Buckeye Pipe Line Company in November, 1953. This company ceased making deliveries to Canada in January, 1954, leaving only two lines operating across the St. Clair river from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their domestic operations and the shortness of these lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these pipe lines follows:
