PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

Oil deliveries from Canadian pipe lines recorded a slight drop during the month of February with a net average of 490,166 barrels per day compared with the record movement of 495,703 barrels in January. This was an increase of 35 p.c. above the February 1963 average of 363,273 barrels, the record at that time.

Net deliveries from trunk lines and gathering systems totalled 13,724,652 barrels in February, some 3,550,000 barrels above the corresponding month last year. Increases were recorded in all provinces except Alberta as follows, (1953 data in brackets): British Columbia, 1,067,235 barrels (nil*); Alberta, 1,266,965 (1,328,945); Saskatchewan, 1,134,025 (1,071,621); Manitoba, 3,142,470 (1,732,736); Ontario, 2,594,523 (1,701,198), and Quebec, 4,519,434 (4,337,142). Included in the Manitoba deliveries were 2,615,478 barrels (1,281,612) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line at Gretna and 526,992 (451,124) delivered within the province. During the month of February 2,636,741 barrels which had been transported through the United States via the Lakehead Pipe Line re-entered Canada at Sarnia as shown in the table at the foot of page 2.

Net receipts of oil for shipment by pipe line during February included 6,868,170 barrels of Alberta orude and 37,055 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 121,939 of Manitoba orude, 4,533,971 imported orude and 2,594,246 barrels of refinery products. Total net receipts at 14,155,381 barrels were 3,893,560 barrels, or 38 p.c. above the corresponding month last year.

The opening of Interprovincial's extension from Superior to Sarnia was largely responsible for the increase shown in net deliveries during the first two months of the year. For January and February deliveries amounted to 29,091,458 barrels as against 20,896,943 in the same period last year, an increase of 39 p.c. Deliveries by provinces for the two-month period were as follows, (1953 data in brackets): British Columbia, 2,007,103 (nil *); Alberta, 2,685,156 (2,917,969); Saskatchewan, 2,355,751 (2,293,814); Manitoba, 7,054,230 (3,414,656); Ontario, 5,431,771 (3,216,427), and Quebec, 9,557,447 (9,054,077). Transfers of oil from the Interprovincial system in Manitoba to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company for movement through the United States, principally to refineries at Sarnia, amounted to 5,984,074 barrels (2,473,080).

Both gathering systems and trunk lines made record deliveries during the month. Gathering systems handled an average of 191,656 barrels per day compared with 189,478 in January and 124,645 barrels in February, 1953, an increase of 54 p.c. over the previous year. Trunk lines handled a daily average of 614,763 barrels, against 588,525 in January and 384,478 in February, 1953, 60 p.c. above last year.

Barrel miles at 4,842 million were almost 90 p.c. above last year's figure of 2,565 million. The average length of haul, however, dropped to 281.3 miles from 300.2 in January, but was well above the 238.2 miles reported in February, 1953.

Employees numbered 1,140 for the month of February, an increase of 31 p.c. over the 869 employees recorded in February of last year. Salaries and wages in the same period rose by 42 p.c., from \$300,953 in February, 1953, to \$428,750 in the month under review.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company continued in the lead with deliveries of 5,499,754 barrels during February and a two-month total of 11,472,757 barrels against a total of 5,894,736 barrels in the same period last year. On a daily basis Interprovincial's deliveries reached a new high with an average of 196,420 barrels per day in February compared with an average of 161,408 barrels for the Montreal Pipe Line Company and 143,080 barrels for Imperial's gathering system. The Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Company passed the million mark in February with total deliveries of 1,067,235 barrels.

Revenue and employee data for the Farnia Products Pipe Lins Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. in Manitoba and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company in Alberta have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

* The Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Company made its first deliveries to British Columbia terminals in October, 1953.

With the completion in December of Interprovincial's extension to Sarnia, there are now three oil pipe lines crossing the St. Clair river from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their domestic operations and shortness of the lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by the three pipe lines follows:
