## PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

Oil pipe lines in Canada recorded a net delivery in September of 14,676,681 barrels or an average of 489,223 barrels per day. This was an increase of 40,643 barrels daily or 9 p.c. over August deliveries and 22 p.c. over deliveries of September last year.

Net receipts for the month totalled 14,883,573 barrels, compared with 14,037,832 in August, up 6 p.c. Included in the net receipts for September were 7,925,333 barrels of Alberta crude, 43,594 of Alberta natural gasoline, 197,588 of Manitoba crude, 3,911,886 of imported crude and 2,805,172 barrels of refinery products.

For the nine months ended September 30, net deliveries amounted to 126,803,852 barrels compared with 107,060,699 for the same period last year, an increase of 18 p.c. Provincial totals for the period were as follows (1953 data in brackets): British Columbia 9,901,622 barrels (nil \*); Alberta 12,552,132 (12,743,628); Saskatchewan 10,372,964 (10,439,842); Manitoba 31,080,959 (25,747,310); Ontario 23,742,746 (18,285,427); and Quebec 39,153,429 (39,844,492). Manitoba deliveries included 26,091,277 barrels (21,195,526) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe line Company at Gretna for transport through the United States, principally destined to refineries at Sarnia. Of the total oil delivered during the nine months under review, refinery products accounted for 23,905,312 barrels, 31 p.c. above the total of 18,285,427 recorded in the corresponding period of 1953.

Gathering systems handled an average of 216,076 barrels per day, up 18 p.c. over September last year. Trunk lines averaged 595,185 barrels per day, 7 p.c. above the August average of 555,639 and 30 p.c. over September, 1953. Barrel miles rose to a new high of 5,699 million compared with 5,589 million in August and 3,764 in September last year. The average haul dropped from 324.5 miles in August to 319.2, but was well above last year's figure of 274.3.

The number of employees was down from 1,210 in August to 1,198, but salaries and wages recorded an increase and average earnings for September amounted to \$3,948 compared with \$3,886 in August and 9 p.c. above the average of \$3,624 earned in September, 1953.

Revenues earned during the third quarter of 1954 amounted to \$10,789,786 compared with \$8,267,545 in 1953. For the nine months ended September 30 revenues totalled \$30,224,274 against \$21,072,795 in 1953, an increase of 43 p.c.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Co. in Alberta, Anglo Canadian Oils Ltd. in Manitoba and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company in Alberta have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report. Operating statistics of the Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Limited, carrying natural gasoline from the compression refrigeration plant at Devon to refineries at Edmonton are included in this report. Employee data are not available for this line.

\* The Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Company made its first deliveries to British Columbia terminals in October, 1953.

With the completion of Interprovincial's extension to Sarnia, the Transit and Storage Company's line from Cygnet, Ohio, to Sarnia was no longer needed and this line was sold to the Buckeye Pipe Line Company in November, 1953. This company ceased making deliveries to Canada in January, 1954, leaving only two Lines operating across the St. Clair river from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their domestic operations and the shortness of these lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these pipe lines follows:
