# PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

Canadian pipe lines recorded a net delivery of 19,926,454 barrels in October, only slightly below the record of 20,054,245 barrels reached in August. This was an average of 642,789 barrels per day as compared with 603,275 in September and 480,045 in October last year.

For the ten months ended October 31, net deliveries amounted to 181,440,143 barrels compared with 142,045,332 for the same period of 1954, an increase of 28 p.c. Of this total, refinery products accounted for 31,176,165 barrels in 1955 against 26-585,678 barrels in the previous year. Provincial deliveries for the ten months were as follows (1954 data in brackets): British Columbia 24,227,134 barrels (11,158,737); Alberta 15,142,919 (13,597,923); Saskatchewan 12,989,591 (12,152,399); Manitoba 42,809,-779 (34,576,115); Ontario 30,646,070 (26,390,231); and Quebec 55,624,650 (44,169,927). Manitoba deliveries included 36,731,430 barrels (28,927,990) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna. Of this, a total of 3,212,646 barrels (1,369,585) was exported to the United States while the remainder returned to Canada at Sarnia.

Net receipts for the month totalled 20,512,249 barrels, almost 32 p. c. above the October 1954 figure of 15,577,508. October receipts included 10,419,081 barrels of Alberta crude and 55,922 of Alberta natural gasoline, 593,771 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 428,862 of Manitoba crude, 5,670,536 of imported crude and 3,344,077 barrels of refinery products.

Both gathering systems and trunk lines handled more oil than in the previous month. Gathering systems delivered an average of 354,438 barrels per day against 313,499 in September while trunk lines handled a daily average of 828,647 barrels against 772,788 in September. Barrel miles rose by 16 p.c. to 7,675 million and the average haul increased from 285 miles in September to 298.8 in the month under review. Total salaries and wages increased from \$537,432 to \$540,097 for an increase of 9 in the number of employees.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.




