

PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

February 1955

Canadian pipe lines recorded a net delivery of 16,074,232 barrels of oil in February. This was a record output of 574,080 barrels per day compared with the previous high of 568,295 barrels in January and 492,019 in February, 1954. Compared with the previous year, total net deliveries increased by almost 17 p.c.

For the two months ended February 28 net deliveries amounted to 33,690,271 barrels compared with 29,186,248 in the same period last year, an increase of 15 p.c. Provincial totals for the first two months of the year were as follows (1954 data in brackets): British Columbia 4,019,492 barrels (2,007,103); Alberta 3,204,271 (2,745,236); Saskatchewan 2,137,813 (2,390,461); Manitoba 7,725,489 (7,054,230); Ontario 6,311,100 (5,431,771) and Quebec 10,-292,106 (9,557,447). Manitoba deliveries included 6,534,860 barrels (5,984,074) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna, destined principally to refineries at Sarnia, and 1,190,629 (1,070,156), delivered within the province. British Columbia deliveries included 843,277 barrels (nil) exported to the United States.

Net receipts for the month of February totalled 16,314,413 barrels, almost 14 p.c. above the 1954 figure of 14,327,977. Included in the month's receipts were 7,811,849 barrels of Alberta crude oil, 49,463 of Alberta natural gasoline, 230,073 of Saskatchewan crude, 252,458 of Manitoba crude, 4,943,055 of imported crude and 3,027,515 barrels of refinery products.

Gathering systems handled an average of 282,053 barrels per day during February compared with 280,663 in the previous month and 197,864 in February, 1954. Trunk lines handled 710,101 barrels per day against 685,319 in January and 614,763 in the previous year. Barrel miles dropped to 5,701 million from 6,254 in January, but were 18 p.c. above the 4,842 million recorded in February last year. The average haul also dropped from 294.4 miles in January to 286.7 in the month under review.

Employees numbered 1,198 and earned \$465,117 in February, 1955, compared with 1,149 employees earning \$432,449 in the corresponding month last year. Average earnings for the month were thus 3 p.c. above the February 1954 average.

It will be noted that the 1954 data shown in this report have been revised to include companies who were in operation but who did not report until later in the year.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, and Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

With the completion of Interprovincial's extension to Sarnia, the Transit and Storage Company's line from Cygnet, Ohio, to Sarnia was no longer needed and this line was sold to the Buckeye Pipe Line Company in November, 1953. This company ceased making deliveries to Canada in January, 1954, leaving only two lines operating across the St. Clair river from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their domestic operations and the shortness of these lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these pipe lines follows:
