PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

MARCH, 1955

The amount of oil carried by Canadian pipe lines reached a new peak in March with a net delivery of 18,561,758 barrels. This was an average of 598,766 barrels per day compared with 576,678 1/ barrels in February and 413,445 in March, 1954, an increase of 45 p.c. over the previous year.

Net deliveries during the first quarter of 1955 amounted to 52,403,634 barrels as compared with 42,003,041 1/ in the same period last year, an increase of 25 p.c. Provincial deliveries for the first three months of the year were as follows, (1954 data in brackets): British Columbia 6,342,778 barrels (3,230,826); Alberta 4,665,600 (3,934,901 1/); Saskatchewan 3,619,767 (3,301,164 1/); Manitoba 11,999,092 (9,236,754); Ontario, 9,789,575 (7,937,651) and Quebec 15,986,822 (14,361,745). Included in Manitoba deliveries were 10,244,879 barrels (7,589,178) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna, destined principally to refineries at Sarnia and 1,754,213 barrels (1,647,576) delivered within the province. Oil exported to the United States via the Trans Mountain Pipe Line during this period amounted to 1,695,220 barrels. No oil was exported by this company prior to October 1954.

Net receipts for March showed an increase over the previous year of 38 p.c. totalling 18,142,315 barrels as against 13,104,068 in 1954. Included in the month's receipts were 8,337,938 barrels of Alberta crude, 57,223 of Alberta natural gasoline, 208,515 of Saskatchewan crude, 308,224 of Manitoba crude, 5,712,350 of imported crude and 3,518,065 barrels of refinery products.

Trunk lines handled an average of 733,422 barrels per day compared with 710,101 in February and 503,484 in March 1954, an increase of 46 p.c. over the previous year. Gathering lines dropped from a daily average of 281,068 barrels in February to 264,480 in March. Barrel miles rose to a new high of 6,748 million from 5,701 in February and 3,977 in March last year. The average length of haul also was up from 286.7 in February to 296.8 in the month under review. Employment showed little change.

Operating revenues for the three months ended March 31st amounted to \$12,870,357, an increase of 32 p.c. over revenues of \$9,753,720 1/ earned in the first quarter of 1954.

Data for the Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd. carrying oil from the Wapella and Dollard fields of Saskatchewan are included for the first time in this report.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, and Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.




