PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

APRIL, 1955

Due to a decreased demand for crude oil all major pipe lines in Canada reported lower deliveries for April. Net deliveries for the month amounted to 15,818,889 barrels, or an average of 527,296 barrels per day. This was a drop of 12 p.c. from the March average of 598,766 barrels but 29 p.c. above the daily average of 406,887 barrels delivered in April last year.

Net deliveries for the four months ended April 30 amounted to 68,222,523 barrels, 26 p.c. above deliveries of 54,223,658* recorded in the same period of 1954. Of this total, refinery products accounted for 13,225,551 barrels, as against 10,503,483 in 1954. Provincial deliveries for the first four months were as follows, (1954 data in brackets): British Columbia, 8,618,407 barrels (4,053,787); Alberta 5,679,030 (5,142,027); Saskatchewan 4,888,321 (4,110,900); Manitoba 14,697,-209 (11,561,245); Ontario 13,050,471 (10,503,483); and Quebec 21,289,085 (18,852,-216). Included in the Manitoba deliveries were 12,332,159 barrels (9,370,462) transferred from the Interprovincial system in Manitoba to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company for shipment through the United States, principally destined to refineries at Sarnia.

Net receipts for the month of April totalled 15,733,202 barrels, down 13 p.c. from March receipts of 18,142,315. Included in the April receipts were 6,508,027 barrels of Alberta crude, 48,664 of Alberta natural gasoline, 247,710 of Saskatchewan crude, 205,726 of Manitoba crude, 5,328,382 of imported crude and 3,394,693 barrels of refinery products.

Gathering systems handled an average of 219,163 barrels per day in April compared with 264,480 in March, down by some 45,000 barrels per day. Trunk lines fell off by 86,484 barrels per day with an average delivery of 646,938 barrels in April against 733,422 in March. Barrel miles at 5,423 million were down by 19.6 p.c. and the average length of haul fell from 296.8 miles in March to 279.4.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, and Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.




