

PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

SEPTEMBER, 1955

Price: \$1.00 per year

Deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines fell off during September. Total net deliveries averaged 603,275 barrels per day, a decrease of 7 p.c. from the August record of 646,911 barrels, but 23 p.c. above the average of 491,619 for September, 1954.

For the nine months ended September 30, net deliveries amounted to 161,513,689 barrels compared with 127,163,928 in the same period of last year, an increase of 27 p.c. Refinery products accounted for 27,842,094 barrels in 1955 as against 23,905,312 in 1954. Provincial deliveries for the nine months were as follows (1954 data in brackets): British Columbia 21,659,273 barrels (9,901,622); Alberta 13,481,397 (12,552,132); Saskatchewan 11,770,706 (10,733,040); Manitoba 37,327,284 (31,080,959); Ontario 27,387,218 (23,-742,746) and Quebec 49,887,811 (39,153,429). Manitoba deliveries included 31,874,197 barrels (26,091,277) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna for transport through the United States, principally destined to Sarnia refineries. The remainder of 5,453,087 barrels (4,989,682) was delivered within the province.

Net receipts for the month totalled 18,594,772 barrels, compared with 14,954,864 in September, 1954, an increase of 24 p.c. Included in the month's receipts were 8,919,-258 barrels of Alberta crude oil and 50,886 of Alberta natural gasoline, 518,210 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 393,873 of Manitoba crude, 5,718,817 of imported crude and 2,993,-728 barrels of refinery products.

Gathering systems handled an average of 313,499 barrels per day in September against 338,480 in August while trunk deliveries dropped to 772,778 barrels per day from 825,255 in August, down by 6 p.c. Barrel miles at 6,608 million were down by 13 p.c. and the average haul decreased to 285.0 miles from 297.3 in August.

Employment fell off during September with 1,292 employees compared with 1,336 in the previous month. Earnings, however, increased in September and the average wage rose to \$416 compared with \$400 in August and \$395 in September, 1954.

Operating revenues for the third quarter were up by 12 p.c. For the mine months ended September 30, revenues amounted to \$42,169,015 compared with \$30,227,560 in the same period of 1954, an increase of almost 40 p.c.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.


