PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

6.1

FEBRUARY, 1956

Oil deliveries from Canadian pipe lines continued upward during the month of February with a net delivery of 753,013 barrels per day compared with the previous record of 734,103 barrels in January 1956. This was an increase of 30.5 p.c. over the February 1955 average of 576,678 barrels per day.

For the two months ending February 29, net deliveries totalled 44,594,563 barrels, against 33,841,876* for the corresponding period last year. Increases were recorded in all provinces as follows (1955 data in brackets): British Columbia 7,124,500 barrels (4,019,-492); Alberta 3,406,051 (3,204,271); Saskatchewan 3,028,227 (2,289,418); Manitoba 11,085,932 (7,725,489); Ontario 7,353,671 (6,311,100) and Quebec 12,596,182 (10,292,106). Included in the Manitoba deliveries were 9,404,622 barrels (6,534,860) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line at Gretna, and 1,681,310 (1,190,629) delivered within the province.

Net receipts for the month of February totalled 22,227,511 barrels compared with 16,382,956 in the same month of 1955. Included in the month's receipts were 11,290,243 barrels of Alberta crude and 57,535 of Alberta natural gasoline, 687,148 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 423,785 of Manitoba crude, 6,143,820 imported crude and 3,624,980 barrels of refinery products.

Gathering lines handled an average of 413,800 barrels per day against 281,068 in the previous year and trunk lines increased from an average of 710,101 barrels in February 1955 to 1,010,943 in the month under review.

Barrel miles totalled 8,773 million for the month of February, compared with 8,631 during January and 5,701 in February 1955, an increase of 54 p.c. over the previous year.

Employees numbered 1,344 and earned \$577,962 in February 1956, compared with 1,198 employees earning \$465,117 in the corresponding month last year, a wage increase of almost 11 p.c.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Mobil Oil of Canada, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd., have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates over 1,500 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 inch pipe coming into Canada across the St. Clair River at Sarnia. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St. Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations data for these two short sections are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia follows:


