MARCH, 1956

Net deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines amounted to 22,838,012 barrels for the month of March. This was an average of 736,710 barrels per day compared with an average of 753,013 barrels last month and 598,766 last year.

Net deliveries from both gathering systems and trunk lines during the first quarter of 1956 amounted to 67,432,575 barrels as compared with 52,403,634 in the same period last year, an increase of 29 p.c. Provincial deliveries for the first three months of the year were as follows (1955 data in brackets): British Columbia 11,189,261 barrels (6,342,778); Alberta 4,992,349 barrels (4,665,600); Saskatchewan 4,437,831 barrels (3,619,-767); Manitoba 16,920,079 barrels (11,999,092); Ontario 11,217,553 barrels (9,789,575) and Quebec 18,675,502 barrels (15,986,822). Included in Manitoba deliveries were 14,314,934 barrels (10,244,879) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna, of this 4,367,810 barrels were for export while the remainder was destined to refineries at Sarnia.

Net receipts for March totalled 23,185,036 barrels as against 18,142,315 barrels in 1955, on increase of 28 p.c. Included in the month's receipts were 12,003,013 barrels of Alberta crude, 56,152 of Alberta natural gasoline, 727,086 of Saskatchewan crude, 486,-729 Manitoba crude, 6,027,235 imported crude and 3,884,821 barrels of refinery products.

Barrel miles totalled 9,326 million for the month of March, compared with *8,742 for the month of February and 6,748 during March 1955, an increase of 38 p.c. over the previous year.

Employees numbered 1,378 and earned \$604,252 in March 1956, compared with 1,208 employees earning \$474,394 in the corresponding month last year, a wage increase of 12 p.c.

The Peace River Oil Pipe Line Company with some 34 miles of gathering system and 107 miles of trunk line commenced operations during March carrying crude oil from the Sturgeon Lake area of Alberta. Operations of the line are included in this report for the first time.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Mobil Oil of Canada, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Peace River Oil Pipe Line Company Ltd., Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd., have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report. OF STATISTICS

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates over 1,500 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 inch pipe coming into Canada across the St. Clair River at Sarnia. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St. Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations data for these two short sections are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia follows:


