PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

APRIL, 1956

Deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines fell off during April with an average net delivery of 699,678 barrels per day, some 37,000 less than the March average and 53,335 barrels below the peak of 753,013 reached in February of this year. Compared with the corresponding month last year total net deliveries were up by almost 33 p.c. totalling 20,990,353 barrels as against 15,818,889 in April, 1955.

For the four months ended April 30 net deliveries amounted to 88,422,928 barrels, 29.6 p.c. above deliveries of 68,222,523 recorded in the same period of 1955. Of this total, refinery products accounted for 15,251,963 barrels, as against 13,225,551 barrels in 1955. Provincial deliveries for the first four months were as follows, (1955 data in brackets): British Columbia 13,873,230 barrels (8,618,407); Alberta 6,446,283 (5,679,030); Saskatchewan 5,832,779 (4,888,321); Manitoba 22,538,245 (14,697,209); Ontario 14,934,494 (13,050,471); and Quebec 24,797,897 (21,289,085). Included in the Manitoba deliveries were 19,199,650 barrels (12,332,159) transferred from the Interprovincial system in Manitoba to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company for shipment through the United States. Of this amount 5,834,044 barrels (645,743) were for export while the remainder was destined to refineries at Sarnia.

Net receipts for the month of April totalled 21,197,428 barrels, down 987,608 barrels from the March receipts of 23,185,036. Included in the April receipts were 10,-057,379 barrels of Alberta crude, 48,387 of Alberta natural gasoline, 756,707 of Saskatchewan crude, 410,453 of Manitoba crude, 6,143,228 of imported crude and 3,781,284 barrels of refinery products.

Gathering systems handled an average of 363,061 barrels per day in April, compared with 411,726 in March, down by some 48,600 barrels per day. Trunk line deliveries dropped by 97,092 barrels per day with an average delivery of 904,037 barrels in April, against 1,001,129 in March.

Barrel miles at 8,107 million were down from 9,333 in March, and the average length of haul fell from 300.7 miles in March to 298.9.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, and Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates over 1,500 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 incb pipe coming into Canada across the St. Clair River at Sarnia. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St. Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations data for these two short sections are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia follows:


