PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

JANUARY, 1957

Canadian oil pipe lines established a new record during January. Total net deliveries of oil amounted to 27,154,521 barrels as compared with 26,243,931 for the month of December, an increase of 910,590 barrels or 3.5 p.c. The daily average rose to a new high of 875,952 barrels, 29,374 barrels above the previous high of 846,578 for December 1956 and 19.3 p.c. above the daily average of 734,103 recorded in January, 1956.

Compared with January, 1956, total net deliveries increased by 4,397,323 barrels. Provincial totals were as follows (1956 data in brackets): British Columbia 5,870,694 barrels (3,359,440); Alberta 1,077,377 (1,833,425); Saskatchewan 1,529,804 (1,622,781); Manitoba 7,128,486 (5,610,642); Ontario 4,525,108 (3,858,581); and Quebec 7,023,052 (6,472,-329). Manitoba deliveries included 6,218,248 barrels (4,748,771) which were delivered to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna. Of this amount a total of 2,016,446 barrels (1,433,814) was for export while the remainder was destined to refineries at Sarnia. Exports via the Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line totalled 2,016,446 barrels and include deliveries at dock for export.

Net receipts during the month of January amounted to 27,704,104 barrels, compared with 23,071,677 in the same month last year, an increase of 20.1 p.c. Included in the January receipts were 13,329,696 barrels of Alberta crude and 63,071 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 2,110,503 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 521,392 of Manitoba crude, 7,067,777 of imported crude and 4,611,952 barrels of refinery products.

Again new records were established when gathering systems handled a daily average of 500,952 barrels and trunk lines delivered an average of 1,247,966 barrels against 491,-748* and 1,183,858 in December, 1956, increases of 1.9 p.c. and 5.4 p.c. respectively.

Barrel miles recorded a new high of 11,231 million for January, 4.2 p.c. above the previous high in December of 10,780 million.

The number of employees increased slightly from 1,600* in December, 1956 to 1,614 in the current month, but average salaries were down from \$471 to \$446.

The December figures shown in this report have been revised to include the Rangeland Pipe Line Company, Limited. This company which gathers oil in the West Joffre, Bentley and Gilby Fields in Alberta commenced operations late in October 1956.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd. have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

Net totals given in Table 6 exceed those in Tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting from intercompany transfers of oil. These differences are accounted for in the following table.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates over 1,500 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 inch pipe coming into Canada across the St. Clair River at Sarnia. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St. Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations data for these two short sections are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia follows:


