PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

NOVEMBER, 1957

With all major companies showing decreases, net deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines dropped to the lowest monthly level in two years, at 20,884,697 barrels some 13.9 p.c. below the November 1956 total of 24,251,985 barrels and 8.1 p.c. below last month's 22,735,509 barrels. As compared with November 1956, barrel miles were down to 6,745 million from 9,933 and the average length of haul to 232.4 miles from 292.3. The November 1957 average length of haul was the lowest recorded since December 1952. Average daily net deliveries of 696,157 barrels compare with 808,400* in the same month a year ago and 733,404 in October this year. Factors contributing to the general decline in deliveries in recent months include a strike at one refinery, increased deliveries by tankers following reductions in rates and decreased exports.

For the eleven months ended November 30, net deliveries recorded an increase of 7.3 p.c. rising to a total of 266,949,982 barrels from 248,696,409 in the same period last year. Provincial deliveries for the period, in barrels, were as follows (1956 data in brackets): British Columbia, 53,311,921 (42,358,109); Alberta, 12,649,065 (16,754,697); Saskatchewan, 16,211,547 (15,249,771); Manitoba, 69,860,132 (66,015,603); Ontario, 40,033,590 (38,726,998); and Quebec, 74,883,727 (69,591,231). Exports via pipe line are shown in a footnote to table 4.

Net receipts during the month of November totalled 21,672,965 barrels, a decrease of 1,859,094 barrels, or 7.9 p.c., from the previous month, and down 3,217,194 barrels, or 12.9 p.c., from the 24,890,159 barrels reported one year ago. November receipts were comprised of 7,821,212 barrels of Alberta crude and 50,388 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 3,178,615 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 442,457 barrels of Manitoba crude, 6,272,454 barrels of imported crude and 3,907,839 barrels of refinery products.

Gathering systems handled a daily average of 361,533 barrels as compared with 398,097 barrels last month, and 469,279 in November 1956. Trunk line deliveries declined to 967,402 barrels daily from 1,032,749 in the previous month, and 1,132,813 in the same month last year.

Although employment and wages registered a slight drop from the previous month both figures showed increases when compared with November 1956. The number of employees rose to 1,666 from 1,595 and salaries and wages to \$788,166 from \$716,244. The average wage was up 5.3 p.c. to \$473 from \$449.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo-Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd. have been omitted. Data of the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates over 1,500 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 inch pipe coming into Canada across the St.Clair River at Sarnia. This short line has now been extended to Clarkson, Ontario. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St.Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia and Clarkson via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations data for these short sections are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia and Clarkson follows:


