Net deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines rose 5.5 per cent in January to 25,-232,890 barrels from 23,907,630 in December but declined 7.1 per cent from last January's record monthly total of 27,167,374* barrels. The daily average delivery was 813,964 barrels as compared with 771,214 in December and 876,366 in January one year ago. Barrel miles at 8,742 million were up 4.8 per cent from December's 8,342 million but down 22.16 per cent from last January's 11,231 million. The average length of haul was only 241.1 miles as compared with 290.3 in January 1957.

Provincial deliveries in barrels for the month were as follows (1957 data in brackets): British Columbia, 3,460,424 (5,870,694); Alberta, 1,325,286 (1,090,330*); Saskatchewan, 1,418,917 (1,529,704*); Manitoba, 7,829,303 (7,128,486); Ontario, 4,244,313 (4,525,108); Quebec, 6,954,647 (7,023,052).

Gathering systems handled an average of 452,748 barrels per day as compared with 501,371 barrels in January 1957 and trunk line deliveries dropped to a daily average of 1,169,654 barrels from the record of 1,247,966 in the previous year.

Net receipts during January totalled 26,008,542 barrels, an increase of 10.9 per cent over the December total but a decrease of 6.2 per cent from the total of 27,726,033 reached in January 1957. Receipts for the month were comprised of 10,570,407 barrels of Alberta crude and 51,072 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 3,609,081 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 519,751 barrels of Manitoba crude, 6,958,958 barrels of imported crude and 4,299,273 barrels of refinery products.

Compared with January 1957, both employees and earnings registered increases. The number of employees rose to 1,661 from 1,621 and earnings increased to \$779,817 from \$721,945. Average earnings at \$469 were up by 5.4 per cent.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo-Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd. have been omitted. Data of the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates over 1,500 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 inch pipe coming into Canada across the St. Clair River at Sarnia. This short line has now been extended to Clarkson, Ontario. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St. Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia and Clarkson via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations data for these short sections are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia and Clarkson follows:


