PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

MARCH, 1958

Deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines continued to lag behind last year. Net deliveries for March were down by 7.3 p.c., dropping to 24,042,401 barrels from 25,940,239* in March, 1957. This was an average of 775,561 barrels per day as against 836,782 in the previous year. Barrel miles fell to 8,910 million from 10,837 in March 1957 and the average length of haul decreased by 17.0 p.c. to 243.6 miles from 293.6

For the first quarter ended March 31, total net deliveries from both gathering and trunk lines dropped 6.4 p.c. to 72,050,645 barrels from 77,000,621 in the same period last year. Provincial deliveries, in barrels, for the first three months of the year were as follows (1957 data in brackets): British Columbia, 9,196,211 (16,756,543); Alberta, 3,487,657 (3,047,445); Saskatchewan, 4,249,428 (4,590,066); Manitoba, 23,158,422 (19,309,949); Ontario, 11,750,429 (13,046,322); and Quebec, 20,208,498 (20,250,296). Included in Manitoba deliveries were 20,201,684 (16,570,623) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna, the bulk of which moved through the United States destined to Ontario refineries. Exports via pipe line are shown in a footnote to Table 4.

Gathering systems handled an average of 447,558 barrels per day as compared with 465,302 in March, 1957, while trunk line deliveries dropped by 3.8 p.c. to a daily average of 1,142,339 barrels from 1,187,329.

Net receipts for the month decreased 7.3 p.c. to 24,296,476 barrels from 26,205,684 in the corresponding month last year. March receipts were comprised of 9,575,885 barrels of Alberta crude and 49,816 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 3,587,144 barrels of Saskatchewan crude, 512,964 barrels of Manitoba crude, 6,672,157 barrels of imported crude and 3,898,510 barrels of refinery products.

Employees numbered 1,662, exactly the same as in March 1957. Earnings however, rose by 5.6 p.c. to \$772,788 from \$731,612.

Operating revenues for the first quarter of the year were down by \$2,816,866, or 12.2 p.c., dropping to \$20,338,249 from \$23,155,115 in the corresponding period of 1957.

Producers Pipelines, Limited has been added to the list of reporting companies. Previously, the operations of this company were included with those of its subsidiary, the Westspur Pipe Line Company.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the pipe line operation of the Anglo American Exploration Company and employee data of the Amurex Oil Development Company, Key Pipe Line Company, Ltd., Mid-Saskatchewan Pipe Lines, Ltd., Nisku Products Pipe Line Company, Anglo-Canadian Oils, Ltd. and Valley Pipe Line Company, Ltd. have been omitted. Data of the activities of these companies have been included in all other applicable sections of the report.

The Interprovincial Pipe Line Company operates some 1,600 miles of line in Canada from Edmonton to the International border near Gretna, Manitoba, along with 7 miles of 30 inch pipe coming into Canada across the St. Clair River at Sarnia. This short line has now been extended to Clarkson, Ontario. The Sun Pipe Line Company also operates lines across the St. Clair River from the United States to Sarnia. Oil delivered at Sarnia and Clarkson via Interprovincial's line would be a duplication of oil already reported on the western section of the line. For this reason and because of the limited nature of their operations, oil carried by these short sections is not included on Canadian oil pipe line statistics. However, commencing with the current report, the barrel mile performance of these sections has been included with the total barrel miles shown in tables five and six. A summary of oil delivered by these two lines at Sarnia and Clarkson follows:


