Net deliveries of natural gas through Canadian pipe lines totalled 37,-313,160 Mcf. in March, up 36.8 per cent from the total of 27,267,522 Mcf. in March, 1960. Daily average sendout was 1,203,650 Mcf. as compared with 879,597 Mcf. Peak day deliveries, uncompensated(1) amounted to 1,482,020 Mcf., while the minimum day sendout of 1,095,491 Mcf. was some 26.1 per cent less. Exports increased 84.8 per cent to 15,787,681 Mcf. from 8,544,915 Mcf. in the previous year. The net deliveries for the twelve month period ending March 31, 1961 were 323,300,337 Mcf.

Alberta accounted for the highest provincial receipts, 74.0 per cent, while the greatest share of domestic deliveries, 53.9 per cent, was made in Ontario.

Total Mcf. miles (not including Ontario Natural Gas Storage and Pipelines, Ltd., calculations of which are not available due to the complexity of their operations) amounted to 37.1 billion or 813,383 ton miles.

Pipeline fuel amounted to 1,015,409 Mcf. during March, while the line pack decreased by 167,088 Mcf.

Duplications in the statistics have occurred as a result of gas being obtained by pipe line transport companies from certain distribution companies, which had in turn originally received the gas from a pipe line transport company. These items are shown separately as "Transfers from Canadian transmission systems" and "Returned to transmission systems by distribution systems for re-delivery".

Gas volumes in this report are measured in cubic feet of 1,000 British thermal units at 14.73 pounds per square inch absolute and at 60°F. Gas volumes in this report are given in thousands of cubic feet (Mcf.).

The Gas Pipe Line Transport Industry is defined as that industry which is engaged in the transportation of natural gas, by pipe line, from natural gas fields or processing plants to local distribution systems. Companies included in this industry obtain the bulk of their revenue from the sale of gas to distribution companies for resale. Those companies that derive most of their revenue from the sale of gas to final consumers are classified as being in the Gas Distribution Industry.

Monthly reports of "Sales of Manufactured and Natural Gas" include summary data of receipts and deliveries of natural gas by transmission and distribution systems combined.
