The attached tables include statistics of telegraph and cable companies operating in Canada. The data of cable companies and foreign telegraph companies are only those of plants located in Canada. Data for the Canadian Pacific, Great North Western Telegraph and Dominion Government systems include their lines and operations in the United States and Newfoundland. The telegraph lines of the Canadian National Railways in the United States are not included and have been deducted from the 1925 data. Marconigrams which are turned over to the telegraph companies for delivery are counted as land messages by the telegraph companies. These messages of this wireless company to and from ships and stations are shown by themselves at the foot of **table 9**. Previously only the private messages sent were reported. Service messages are messages that are re-transmitted or passed from station to station until they can be delivered to the ship. Cablegrams are not counted as telegrams when forwarded over land wires.

Gross revenues of the companies as a whole showed an increase during the year of \$623,066, or 5.4 per cent and net operating revenues were greater by \$138,226.

The number of telegrams sent increased by 762,404, or 6.6 per cent, and the cablegrams sent increased by 95,542, or 10 per cent while the cablegrams received, exclusive of those received by the Western Union and relayed to the United States, increased by 81,555, or 13 per cent. The money transferred by telegraph amounted to \$7,790,127, which was an increase of \$1,109,532, or 16 per cent.

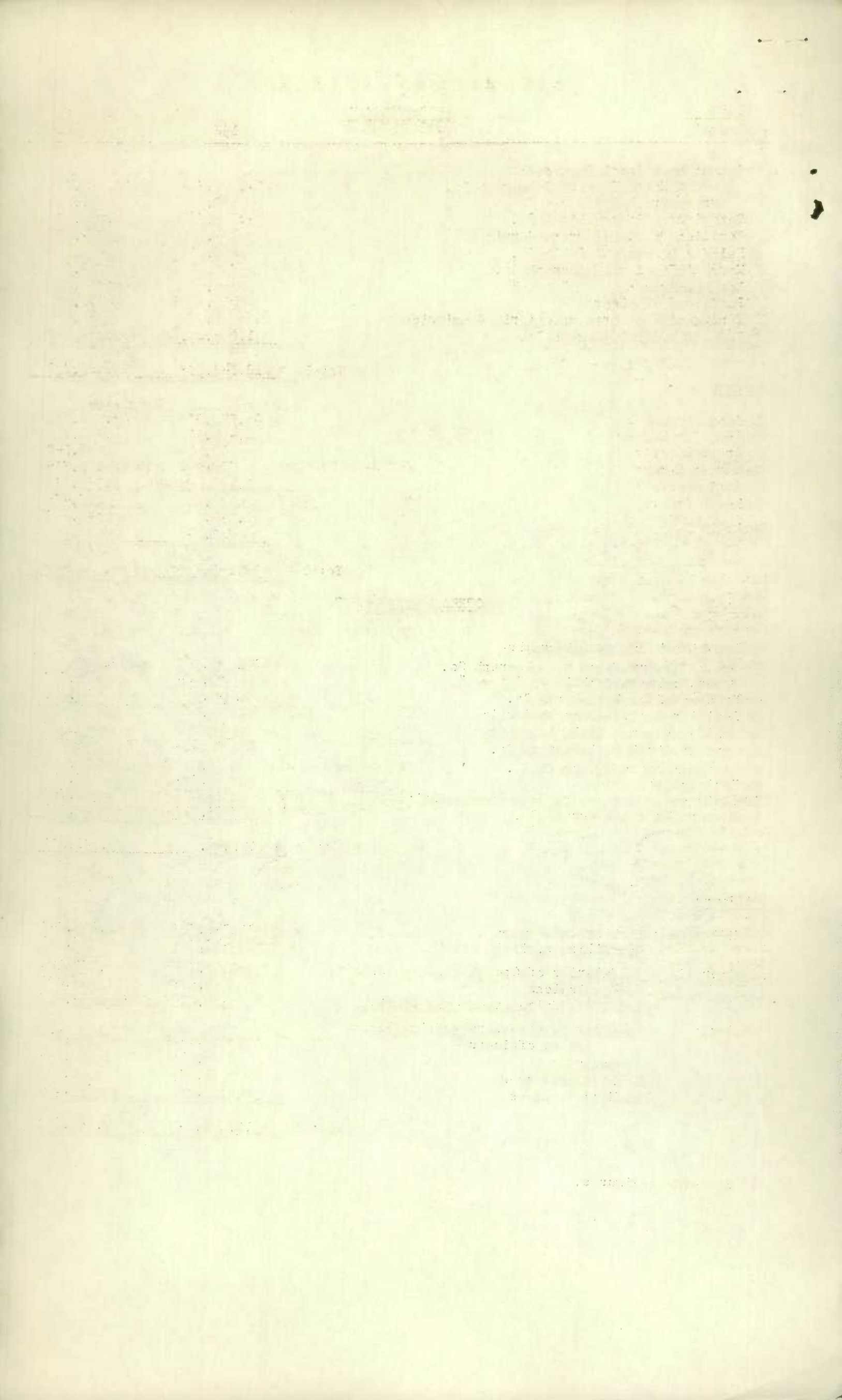
