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
1. Preliminary Electric Energy Statistics, July 1967

Net generation of electric energy increased 5.3% to 12,461,-050 thousand kwh. in July 1967 from 11,827,215 thousand kwh. generated one year ago. Output from hydro plants was up 4.5% while thermal generation increased 10.5%.

Imports were up 10.2% while exports declined by 2.5%. For the sixth consecutive month, there was a substantial decrease in the amount of secondary energy used in Canada. As a result, firm energy used in Canada increased 6.7% to 12,373,882 thousand kwh. in July 1967 from 11,596,884 thousand kwh. in July 1966.

Total net generation for the twelve month period ending July 31, 1967 amounted to 163,314,271 thousand kwh.



2. Refined Petroleum Products, June 1957

Production of refined petroleum products increased 6.4% in June to 33,387,989 barrels from 31,384,534 in the same month last year, according to an advance release of data that will be contained in the June issue of the DBS report "Refined Petroleum Products."

Receipts of crude oil increased 6.4% in June to 32,694,480 barrels from 30,713-844 a year earlier. There was 7.6% more domestic crude at 19,380,333 barrels versus 18,010,872 and, 4.8% more imported crude at 13,314,147 barrels versus 12,702,972. Domestic disappearance of finished petroleum products increased 6.3% to 35,112,430 barrels from 33,025,009 in the same month last year.
