## 1. Coal and Coke Statistics, March 1968


Coal production for the month of March 1968 amounted to 1,002,267 tons a decrease of 5.4% from the March 1967 production of 1,059,488 tons, while landed imports were 85,987 tons compared with 82,109 tons for the month of March 1967. Consumption by industrial consumers amounted to 1,560,617 tons of coal and 542,820 of coke, an increase of 3,598 tons of coal and a decrease of 53,626 tons of coke from last year.

Industrial consumers' stocks of coal and coke increased to 3,986,264 tons from 3,842,044 tons in March 1967.

Coke production during the month of March 1968 increased to 482,490 tons from 356,291 tons in March 1967, while coke used in blast furnaces increased to 391,222 tons from 324,190 tons during the same period.


