1. Refined Petroleum Products December 1967

Production of refined petroleum products increased 1.6% in December to 34,950,952 barrels from 34,389,257 in the same month last year, according to an advance release of data that will be contained in the December issue of the DBS report "Refined Petroleum Products."

Receipts of crude oil increased 0.9% in December to 34,222,623 barrels from 33,913,613 a year earlier. There was 0.7% less domestic crude at 19,395,742 barrels versus 19,539,145 and, 3.1% more imported crude at 14,826,881 barrels versus 14,374,468. Domestic disappearance of finished petroleum products increased 3.7% to 45,316,097 barrels from 43,684,196 in the same month last year.

2. Coal and Coke Statistics, December 1967

Coal production for the month of December amounted to 1,026,730 tons a decrease of 12.6% from the December 1966 production of 1,174,225 tons, while landed imports were 757,509 tons compared with 527,018^F tons for the month of December 1966. Consumption by industrial consumers amounted to 1,553,694 tons of coal and 449,521 tons of coke, an increase of 31,150 tons of coal and an increase of 38,204 tons of coke from last year.

Industrial consumers' stocks of coal and coke increased to 6,654,319 tons from 6,299,512 tons in December 1966.

Coke production during the month of December 1967 increased to 397,122 tons from 337,225 tons in December 1966, while coke used in blast furnaces increased to 304,698 tons from 255,019 tons during the same period.

3. Coal and Coke Statistics, 1967

During the year 1967, coal production amounted to 11,395,754 tons as compared to 11,391,569 tons in 1966, an increase of 0.04%. Production decreases of 116,047 tons in Nova Scotia, 60,352 tons in New Brunswick and 70,018 tons in Saskatchewan were offset by increased production amounting to 134,305 tons in Alberta, and 116,297 tons in British Columbia and Yukon.

Landed imports in 1967 amounted to 15,823,336 tons, a decrease from 16,335,759 tons imported in 1966. Exports (as reported by coal producers) increased to 1,211,840 tons from 1,110,268 tons in 1966.

Industrial consumption of coal increased 4.6% in 1967 while industrial stocks increased to 6,384,327 tons from 5,988,552 tons in 1966. The increased industrial consumption was due, in large part, to a 37% increase in thermal electric generation.

4. Preliminary(1) Report on Coal Production

January 1968

Preliminary coal production for the month of January amounted to 1,088,402 tons a decrease of 9.8% from the January 1967 preliminary production of 1,207,079 tons. Landed imports were 109,765 tons compared with 121,324 tons for the same period last year.
