BANK DEBITS TO INDIUIDUAL 1CCOUNTS, JNUURY, 1935.
Cheques cashed against individual accounts by the branch banks in the 32 clearing centres of the Iominion amounted to $\$ 2,682,000,000$ in January, compered with $\$ 2,597,000,000$ in the same month of last year. The gain of $3.3 . p . c$. represents an expansion in business operations and a higher level of security and comodity prices.

The gain over the same month of 1934 was general in each of the five economic areas except British Columbia. I slight increase was recorded in the Maritime Provinces, the total in January last having been $\$ 43,509,000$. Halifax and Saint John showed advances in this comparison, while the level in "oncton was somewhat lower.

Gains were shown in the three centres of the province of Guebec, the net increase in the area having been 2.3 p.c. The gain in Vontreal was less then one per. cent.

Ten of the 13 centres in Ontario showed increases over January 1934. The decline in Toronto was nearly 4 p.c., while the increase for the province mas 1.4 p.c. Debits in the Prairie Provinces mere $\$ 435,391,000$ compared mith $\$ 381,652,000$ in the seme month of 1934, a gain of 14.1 p.c., while the increase in minnipeg mas 15.6 p.c. Benk debits were less during January in each of the three centres of British Columbia then in the same month of last year. The declines in $\nabla$ ancouver and the Province were 1.8 p.c. and2.6 p.c., respectively.

## Comparison with December 1934 after Seasonal 1 dustment

A gain of 4.1 p.c. was shown in brik debits in Jonuary over the preceding month after seasongl edjustment. Quebec was the only one of the five economic areas not showing an increase in this comparison. A slight gain mas recorded in the Maritime Provinces after seasonal ao justment. The declines in "ontreal and Quebec province were 3.9 p.c. and 2.1 p.c., respectively. The adjusted gain in Ontario was 2.3 p.c. . while Toronto recorded an increase of 1.3 p.c. After seasonal adjustment. the gain in Winnipeg was $6.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while the to $\mathrm{m}_{\mathrm{l}}$ for the Prairie Provinces was up 9.2 p.c. The gain in $\nabla$ ancouver was $2.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., and on adjusted increase of less than $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. wes recorded in British Columbia.

## Long Term Comparisons

Bank debits in the Tominion during January vere greater than in the same month of any year since 1930. Except for January last year debits in Toronto mare greater than in the same month of any year since 1929. The Montreal total ans in excess of any January since 1931. The Tinnipeg and Prairie Province totals were larger than in the same month for any other year since 1930.

## Turnover of Bank Deposits

As the percentage gain in bank deposits mas greater than that in bank debits, the turnover of the former was at a lower level in January than in the same month of last year. The sum of the demand and notice deposits mas $\$ 1,983,000,000$ on December 31, compared in th $\$ 1,859,000,000$ on the same date one year ago, the gain being 6.7 p.c. The increase in bank debits was 3.3 p.c., the turnover of deposits being 135.3 p.c. compared with 139.7 in January of last year.

## Comparison mith other Economic Factors <br> after Seasonal Ad justment Wherever Necessary.

The index of bank debits mas 109.5 in Januery compared with 105.2 in December. Wholesale and common stock prices were higher in January, the indexes moving up 0.4 p.c. and $2 . g$ p.c., respectively. Trading on the Montreal stock exchange was considerably greater then in December.
