## BANK DHBITS TO INDIVIDUAT ACCOUNTS, OCTOBER 1935

Financial transfers in the form of bank debits at $\$ 2,907,500,000$ in October against $\$ 2,426,000,000$ in the preceding month recorded a gain of less than normal for the season. Making allowance for the seasonal tendencies, the indicated decline would be nearly $3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

The adjusted decline in the Maritime Provinces was 1.7 p.c., the total in October having buen $\$ 50,700,000$. The gains in Montroal and the province of Quabec were considerably less than normal for the season. The decline, after adjustment, in Montreal was 12.7 p.c., while the total for the province of Quabce was down 11.5 p.c. Bank debits in Ontario were $\$ 1,102,000,000$ in Octobor against $\$ 982,000,000$ in September, but the increase was 3 p.c. less than the seasonal tendency. The adjusted decline in Toronto was nearly 6 p.c. The total for the Prairic Provinces was about $\$ 820,000,000$ against $\$ 564,000,000$ in Septomber, but tho duclino after sonsonal adjustmont was about 3 p.c. Tho recession in Winnipog after the usual adjustmont was 4.6 p.c. Dobits in British Columbia wero practically maintained after adjustment, a decline of 0.6 p.c. being shown in Vancouvur.

## Comparison with Octobur 1934

Despite tho gains in tho haritimos and the Prairie Provinces, the Dominion total in October was $14.8 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. below the corresponding month of last year. is gain of 8.1 p.c. was shown in the Maritime Provinces. Considerable declines were shown in Montreal and in the province of Quebec in this comparison. The drop in the provincial total was nearly 18 p.c. The bank debits of Ontario were $\$ 1,102,000,000$ in October against $\$ 1,487,000,000$ in the same month of last year, a decline of nearly $26 \mathrm{p} . c$. The drop in Toronto was slightly more than 27 p.c. The gain in the Prairie Provinces mas $7 \frac{1}{2}$ p.c., Winnipeg baing up nearly 3 p.c. Doclines of 1.2 p.c, and 4.2 p.c. were shown in Vancouver and in British Columbia, respectivoly.

## Comparison with tho First Ten Months of 1234

The Dominion total for the first ten months of 1935 was $\$ 25,592,000,000$ compared with $\$ 26,734,000,000$ in the semu period of 1934 . The consequent decline was $\$ 1,142,000,000$ or 4.3 p.c. Increases wore shown in the Laritime Provincus and in British Columbia in this comparison, while tho other three economic areas recorded recesstons. Tho liaritimo total showed an incruase of $4.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., gains being recorded in each of the three clearing contres. Despite an increase of $7.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. In the city of Quebec, the cumulative total for tha provinco of the same name declinod 5.6 p.c. Nine of the thirteen centres in Ontario recorded increases. The total for the province, however, showed a decline of nearly $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decline in Toronto was $\$ 594,000,000$ or about 6.4 p.c. Only two of the ton centres in the Prairia Provinces showod dacines in this comparison and tho total for the economic aroa showed a duclino of 0.7 p.c. The increaso in Regina was 3.1 p.c. Edmonton and Calgary showed gains of 8.4 p.c. and 11 p.c., rospectively. Owing to the incroases in Victoria and New Westminstor, the total for British Columbis showod a gain of 0.6 p.c. The duclinu in Vancouver was limited to 0.4 p.c.

## Turnover of Bank Doposits

The percentage of bank debits to deposits was 142.9 in October against 179.4 in the same month of last yoar. The sum of the demand and notice deposits increased in the same period from $\$ 1,900,000,000$ to $\$ 2,034,000,000$, while the decline in bank debits was 14.8 p.c.

## Comparison with Other Economic Factors

The index of bank debits, aftor sasoncl adjustmont, dropped from 102.9 in Soptomber to 100 in Octobur. An approciable gain was shown in the index of the physical volume of businoss besed on 45 factors. The index of wholesale prices was somewhat higher, resulting in a new maximum on the recovery. The index of common stock prices incruased from 93.6 to 96.1 , which was also a new high point for several years. The index of shares tradod on the Montrual Stock Exchange was 62.6 compared with 48.6 .
