

## BANK DABITS IO IDDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, DECMABER, 1935

Financial transfers in the form of cheques cashed to individual accounts by the branch banks in the thirty-two clearing centres showed, after seasonal adjustment, a gain of nearly 1 p.c, in Decomber over the proceding month. Gains in this comparison were limited to the Western areas, an increase of $9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. being shown in the Prairie Provinces and of 4.7 p.c. in British Columbia. The totals for the threz Zastern economic areas sowed declines from November. The results were affected by the occurrence of five Suidays in the last month of the year.

The decline in the laritime Provinces was contrary to seasonal tendencies. The adjusted decline in the province of Quebec was about $5 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. A considerable drop was shown in Toronto, while the other centres of Ontario made on balence a somewhat better showing. The duclines in Toronto and in Ontario were 8.2 p.c. and 5 p.c., ruspectively. Thu seasonally adjusted debits of Winnipeg showed an increase of noarly 12 p.c. and the net resilt for the ten centres of the Prairio Provinces was a gain of 9 p.c. Eritish Columbia showed an adjustod gain of 4.7 p.c., while Vancouver was up 1.6 p.c.

## Comparison with Documber, 1934

While the Waritime Provinces and the Western areas recordod gains over Decomber of last year, the Dominion total roceded 3.5 p.c. The Maritime Provinces recorded a gain of 8.7 p.c., advances being shown in Halifax and koncton. The decline in the province of Quebec was nearly 9 p.c., the showing being due to the fact that increase in Quebec and Sherbrooke failed to offset the decline in Montreal. Ten of the thirteen centres in Ontario showed increasos over the same month of last year, but the total for the province declined $10 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. This was due mainly to the declines in Toronto and Ottawa. Six of the ton centres in the Prairie Provinces recorded gains, the increase in Winnipeg being 15.2 p.c. The net result for the area was a gain of nearly 17 p.c. British Columbia scored in this comparison, the gain in Vancouver being $19.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. An increase of $17.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. was shown in the aggregate for the province.

## Comparison with the Preceding Year

Owing to declines in Quebec and Ontario, the Dominion total of bank debits for 1935 was 4 p.c. less than in the preceding yuar. The total was $\$ 31,546,000,000$ compared with $\$ 32,867,000,000$. The increase in the Maritime Provinces was 7.5 p.c., the total in 1935 having been moro than $\$ 574,000,000$. Increases were shown in each of the threo clearing centres of the area. The annual total for the province of Queboc, due mainly to the decline in Montreal, showod a dropping off of 5 p.c. An increase of $10 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. was shown in the city of Quebec. Three only of the thirteen centres in Ontario recorded declinus fror the preceding year, the duclines in Ottawa and Toronto having e predominant influence on the general result. The decline for Ontario was 7 p.c., the total in 1935 having buen $\$ 13,877,000,000$. Duspite duclines in Winnipog and Brandon, the totnl for the ten cuntres of the Prairie Provinces showed a gain of 1.7 p.c. The declino in Minnipug was limitud to l.l p.c. Goneral gains wore shown in the three centres of British Columbia, the nut rusult being a gain of nearly 3 p.c. Debits in Vancouver wore $\$ 1,350,000,000$, a gain of 2.2 p.c. over 1934.

## Comparison with Othur Bconomic Factors

The index of banis debits after suasonal adjustmont advanced from 100.8 in November to 101.5 in the month mader review. The index of mployment in manufacturing plants with seasonal adjustmunt advanced from 102.4 to 104.9. The indox of the physical volume of business, on the other hand, recuded from 110 to 106.2. The wholeselc pricu level was practically maintained in December, while the index of common stocks advenced from 105.8 to 107.4. Trading was less active than in Novumber, when a. maried advance took place in comron stock prices.
