## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, NOVEMBER, 1936.

Financial transfers in the form of bank debits showed a gain of 13.7 p.c. In the first eleven months over the same period of the preceding year. Iwentyoight of the thirty-two clearing centres participated in the increase. Four centres in the Prairie Provinces falled to participate in the advance. British Columbia showed the greatest percentage increase of any of the five oconomic areas, the gain in Vancouver and Victoria exceeding 24 p.c. Owing to the marked increase in Montreal, the Province of quebec also showed a pronounced advance, the aggregate for the three centres of the Province recording a gain of $21 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

The gain in Halifex was $10.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., substantial increases being shown in Saint John and Moncton. The net increase for the three recording centres of the Maritime Provinces wes 9.8 p.c. Fach of the thirteen centres of Ontario recorded gains in this comparison, the total for the Province being up at 12.4 p.c. The greatest percentage increase was shown in Windsor and Sudbury which recorded gains of $58.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $31.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., respectively. Bank debits in Toronto were $\$ 10,869,000,000$ in the first elevan months of 1936 , representing a gain of $\$ 1,213,000,000$ or 12.6 p.c. The gain in the Prairie Provinces was limited to 3.7 p.c., increasea being shom in six out of the 10 clearing centres. The gain in Winnipeg wes 4.3 p.c., the greatest percentage increase being shown in Hoose Jaw, where the advance was 14.5 p.c. The net result for the three Provinces was a gain of 3.7 p.c.

Comparison with Other Economic Factors.
The index of bank debits after seasonal adjustment was 110.1 in November against 100.8 in the same month of last year. Marked gains were also ahown in the other major economic factors indicative of Canadian conditions. The index of the physical volume of business was about 121 against 110 in November 1935. The gain in the index of wholesale prices was 7267 to 7712 . Despite the advance in the last quarter of 1935, the index of common stock prices showed a marked lead over November of last year. The advance was from 105.8 to 131.8 in the month under review. The index of shares traded on the Montreal stock exchange was 266.8 against 143.8 in November 2935. The turnover of banis deposits inoreased from $144.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to $151.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The sum of the demand and notice deposits as at the first of November, 1935, was $\$ 2,090,509,000$, while the sum of these accounts stood at $\$ 2,174,601,000$ at the beginneng of last November. In the meantime, bank debits increased from $\$ 3,021,511,000$ to \$3,302,562,000.

Comparison with the Same Month of 1935.
Bank debits in November were $\$ 3,302,600,000$ against $\$ 3,021,500,000$ In the same month of lest year. The indicated gain of 9.3 p.c. represents acceleration in business and speculative activity as well as a higher level of prices. Each of the five economic areas, except the Prairie Provinces, recorded increase in this comection. The gain in the Naritime Provinces was lp.c. Debits in Montreal were up 23 p.c., while the total in Quebec showed an increase of $23.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Ten of the thirteen centres in Ontario recorded gains over the same month of last year. The total in Toronto was $15.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. greater and a similar increase was shown in the aggregate for the Province. Bank debits in Winnipeg were $\$ 305,800,000$ against $\$ 458,400,000$ in Sovember, 1935, a decline of about 33.3 p .c. The net result for the three Provinces was a docline of 25 p.c. Bank debits in British Columbia showed a gain of nearly 17 p.c., Vencouver being up about 15 p.c.

## Comparis on with October 1936 after Seasonal Adjustment.

Bank debits in November at $\$ 3,302,600,000$ showed a decline from October when the total of cheques eashed amounted to $\$ 3,328,000,000$, the decline after seasonal adjustment being 3.8 p.c. Increases were shown in each of the five economic areas, except the Prairie Provinces, where there was a decline of 35.5 p.c. Bank debits for the Maritimes and Quebec showed an increase of 16 p.c. and 13.7 p.c. respectively, the gain in Nontreal heving been $15 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. Wile the increase in Toronto after seasonal adjustment was 13 p.c., the total for the Province was only 5 p.c. The gain in British Columbia in this comparison was lit p.c., Vancouver showing an increase of $9.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.
