## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAI ACCOUNTS, MARCH, 1936

Financial transfers in the form of bank debits showed an increase of 16 p.c. in liarch over the same month of last year. Increasos were shown in cach of the fivc economic areas. The gain in the liaritime Provinces was from $\$ 39,900,000$ to $\$ 46,400,000$. Increases of $20.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $16.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Were shown in Montreal and the province of Quebec, respectively. Gains were rucordod in each of the thirteen centres of Ontario. The nut result for the province was a gain of $8.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the debits in Toronto being up 10.1 p.c. A marked gain was shown in the bank debits of Winnipeg, the increase buing 57 p.c. The total for the throu Prairic Provinces showed a gain of 39.5 p.c. Debits in Vancouver were 25 p.c. greater, the total for British Columbia buing up 23.7 p.c. The Dominion toteil for liarch Was $\$ 2,599,000,000$ against $\$ 2,236,000,000$ in the same month of last year.

## Comparison with the First Quarter of 1935

The dollar volume of business in the first quarter of 1936 was $\$ 8,358,000,000$ compared with $\$ 7,007,000,000$ in the same period of last year. The increase of $\$ 1,351,000,000$ or 19.3 p.c., represented greater activity in speculation and business. Only four of the thirty-two contres in Canda fallod to ragistor an increase in this comparison. The gain in the Maritime Provinces wns nuarly 17 p.c. Montreal recorded an increase of $24 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and the provincial total wes up $22.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Ivelve of the thirteen contres in Ontario reported gains in this comparison, the net increase for the province being 9 p.c. The gein in Toronto was $\$ 292,000,000$ or 11 p.c. iight of the ten centres in the Prairie Provinces showed gains over the first quarter of 1935. The increase in Wimipeg was $60.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and the total for the economic area was 43.4 p.c. greater. Each of the three centros in British Columbia showed a gain. The increase in Vancouver amounted to 32.3 p.c. and the total for British Columbia at $\$ 502,000,000$ was up 30.8 p.c.

## Comparison with February, 1936, after Seasonal Adjustmont

Bank debits showed decline in harch from the high levol of the proceding month, the Dominion total after sensonal adjustmont being down $13.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The adjusted total for the Maritime Provinces was practically maintained. A decline of 9.6 p.c. was shown for the province of Quebec, Hontreal buing down 10.1 p.c. A decline of 10.9 p.c. was recorded in Toronto with a decrease of 12.4 p.c. in the total for Ontario. Winnipeg's decline was $14.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the total for the Prairie Provinces being down 10.9 p.c. The total for British Columbia was 13 p.c. less than in February, a decline of $9.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. having buen shown in Vancouver.

## Comparison with Other Economic Factors

The adjusted index of bank debits wns 111.3 in March against 128.9 in Fobruary and 95.7 in March of lnst year. The indexes of prices of common stocks and commodities at wholesnle showed moderate rocessiohs from the preceding month and advances over the same month of last year. The gain in the index of common stock prices in the twelve-month comparison was from 84.4 to 117.4 . The index of wholesale prices advanced from 71.9 to 72.4 in the same comparison. Specilative trading was less active in March than in Fobruary but showed a considerablo gain over March 1935.

The percentage of bank debits to deposits was 126.7 in Merch against 115.0 in the samo month of last yoar. Bank deposits in the interval advanced from $\$ 1,945,000,000$ to $\$ 2,051,000,000$. The increase in bank debits was frem $\$ 2,236,000,000$ to $\$ 2,599,000,000$. The turnover of bank dubits was somewhat less in March than in February.
