BANT DRBITE TO IADIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, APRIL, 1936
Financial transfers in the form of bank debits were 17 p.c. greater in April than in the sane month of last year. Higher levels in business operations and in speculative activity accounted for the marked increase in the cashing of cheques. Each of the economic areas recorded gains in this comparison, the greatest having been shown in Quebec. The gain in the Maritime Provinces was 12.7 p.c. Montreal and the province of Quabec recorded gains of 44.2 p.c. and 41.4 p.c., respectively. Twelve of the thirteen centres in Ontario recorded increases over the same month of last year. The gain in Toronto was 5.4 p.c., while the provincial total was 8.7 p.c. greater. A gain of neariy 7 p.c. Was shown in Minnipeg, while the total for the three Prairie Provinces vias up 2.4 p.c. Marked gains were shown in British Columbia, the total for the province being nearly 20 p.c. greater and the gain in Vancouver was 23.2 p.c.

## Compari son with March after Seasonal Adjustment

A moderate gain was shown in bank dubits, after seasonal adjustment, over the preceding month. The increase in the Dominion total was 3.8 p.c. Each of the five economic areas except Ontario recorded gains in this comparison. The total for the Maritime Provinces showed a very slight gain over March after the usual adjustment. The gain in Montreal was $7.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}_{\text {. , while }}$ the adjusted total for Quebec was up 6.1 p.c. A decline of 6.2 poc. was shewn in Tcronto after seasonal adjustment, while the total for Ontario was down 3.5 p.c. Marked gains were shown in Winnipeg and the Prairie Provinces, the gains being 30.1 p.c. and 22.6 p.c., respectively. The gain in Vancouver was $5.8 p_{0} c_{0}$, whilo tho aggregate for British Columbia was 2.2 p.c., greater.

Comparison the First Four honths of 1935
Twenty-seven of the thirty-two clearing centres in Canada showed gains in the first four months of the present year over the corresponding period of 1935 . The Dominion total for the olapsed portion of the present year was $\$ 11,132,000,000$ compared with $\$ 9,374,000,000$ in the same period of last year. The marked gain of 18.8 p.c. represents considerable bettermant in the oconomic situation over the first four months of last year. Cainswero general in the three reporting centres of the Maritime Provinces, the aggregato gain for the area having been $15.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The gain in Montreal was cutstanding, the advancement having been from $\$ 2,510,000,000$ to $\$ 3,238,000,000$, rosuifing in an increase of $\$ 728,000,000$ or $29 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The gain in the aggregate for the province of Quebec was nearly 27 poc. sleven of the thirteen centros of Ontario recorded gains in this compariscn, the total for the first four months of the present year having been $\$ 4,756,000,000$ against $\$ 4,457,000,000$ in the same period of 1935. This represents an increase of 9 p.c. The gain in Toronto was 9.7 p.c. and Hamilton recorded an increase of 17.8 p .c. The gain in Windsor was from $\$ 85,000,000$ to $\$ 148,000,000$, representing $7{ }^{\prime}+\mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. The gain in the Praf rie Provinces was more than $30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., eight of the ten centres recording increases in this comparison. The showing in Jinnipeg was spectacular, cheques cashed in the first four monthe of this year having been $\$ 1,444,000,000$ against $\$ 1,013,000,000$ in the samo poriod of 1935. The consequent gain mas $\$ 43,000,000$ or 42.5 p.c. Harked gains wera recorded in each of the three centres of British Columbia, the total for the province recording an increase of nearly 28 p.c. Debits in Vancouver at $\$ 554,000,000$ showed an increase of practically 30 p.c.

## Comparison with Other Factors

The index of bank dejits on the base of 1926, after seasonal adjustment, was 115.5 in April against 111.3 in March and 98.6 in the same month of last year. Indexes showing the trend of common stock prices and of speculative activity recorded decline from March but a considerable advance over April, 1935. The index of wholesale prices was 72.2 in April against 72.4 in March and 72.5 in April of last year. The percentage of bank debits to demand and notice deposits was 132 in April against 120.8 in April of last year. Gains were recorded in deposits, but the increase of bank debits was in much greater proportion.
