BANK DPBITS ：O INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNIS，AUGUSI，1936．
Financial transfers in the form of bank debits showed an increase of nearly 5 p．c．in August over the same month of last year，three of the five economic areas recording gains in this comparison．The decline in the Prairie Provinces was substantial，while a slight recession was shown in the Maritime Provinces．

Gains were shown in the bank debits of Moncton and Saint John over August 1935，while Halifax recorded a decline。 Tha net result was that the total for the Maritime Provinces receded l． $\mathrm{D}_{\mathrm{c}} \mathrm{c}$ ．Gains \＃ere recorded in each of the three clear－ ing centres Quebec，the gain for the province being $16 \frac{1}{2}$ p．c．Bank debts in Montreal at $\$ 732,800,000$ recorded a gain of $1 \% p_{0} c$ ．Twelve of the thirtoon centres in Ontario recorded gains in this comparison．Debita in Toronto were up $7,8 \mathrm{p}_{0} \mathrm{c}_{0}$ ，the total in August having been $\$ 829,700,000$ ．The net result for the province，was a gain of 10.2 p．c．Six of the ten centres in the Prairio Provincec recorded gains．Necline of more than 24 p．c．was shown in Minnipeg，the net result for the econoraic area being a decline of 18 p．c．Advances were shown in the three clearing centres of British Columbia，Van－ couver recording a gain of nearly 15 p 。 c 。 The agcregate for British Columbia was 17 p．c． greater．

## Comparison With July after Seasonal Adjustmont．

Bark debits for the Dominion were $\$ 2,619,000,000$ in August against $\$ 2,894,000,000$ in July．The decline after seasonal adjustment was limited to 3 p．c． Each of the economic areas recorded slight recessions．The decline in the Maritime provinces was slightly more then $3 p_{0} c_{0}$ ．The increase in Quebec was less than normal for the season，the adjusted total being down ê． 3 p．c．A slight gain was recorded in Toronto after seasonal adjustment over the peceding months but the provincial total recorded a decline of 2.6 p，c．The Zevits：of Winnipeg receded 4.2 p．c．after seasonal adjustment，while the total for the Prairie Pruvinces was dom 8.6 poc．The adjusted dobits of British Columbia showed a recession of $S_{0} 7 p_{0} c_{n}$ ，the Vancuuver total being 11.4 p．c．less．

## Comparison with the First E ght Months of 1935.

Bank debits in the first eight months of 1936 were $\$ 22,760,000,000$ against $\$ 20,259,000,000$ in the same period of 1935 ．The gain of $12,3 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$ ．represents the acceleration in business and spectazation，each of the economic areas recording increases in this comparison．The Maritime provinces showed a gain of $\$ 40,000,000$ or about 11 p．c．The gain in the province of quebec was substantial，amounting to more than $\$ 1,100,000,000$ ，the increase In Montreal was $20.3 p_{0} c_{0}$ ；the net result for the province being a gain of 19 poc．Each of the thirteen centres of Ontario，except Ottawa， showed increases for the first eight months of 1935 ．The gain in Toronto was 7.3 p．c．， while the total for the province สas up $7.7 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$ 。 Soven of the ten centres in the Prairie Provinces showed gains for the first eight months of 1935，the aggregate boing up 9.8 p．c．Winnipeg recorded an increase of 13.4 poc．Iach of the three centres of British Columbla showed marked gaine over the same period of 1935 ，The gain for the province was $25 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$ ．and Vancouver recorded an edvance of 2.5 .3 poco

## Comparison with Other Fconomic Factor：S．

The gessousing adjusted inder of bank dobits on the base of 1926 was 116.2 in August against 119.8 in July and 110.8 in August of last year．Wholesale prices were considerably higher in August than in the proceding month or in the same month of last year．A slight increase is shown in common gtcnis pas zes over the preceding month；the advance from August of last year was about 21 p．c．Trading on the Montreal stock exchange was less active in July．According to preliminary compilation，the index of the physical volume of business was higher in August than in July，a consider－ able gain having been recurded over Augast of last yoer．
