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

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BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, AUGUST, 1936.

Financial transfers in the form of bank debits showed an increase of nearly 5 p.c. in August over the same month of last year, three of the five economic areas recording gains in this comparison. The decline in the Prairie Provinces was substantial, while a slight recession was shown in the Maritime Provinces.

Gains were shown in the bank debits of Moncton and Saint John over August 1935, while Halifax recorded a decline. The net result was that the total for the Maritime Provinces receded 1.2 p.c. Gains were recorded in each of the three clearing centres of Quebec, the gain for the province being 16½ p.c. Bank debts in Montreal at \$732,800,000 recorded a gain of 17 p.c. Twelve of the thirteen centres in Ontario recorded gains in this comparison. Debits in Toronto were up 7.8 p.c., the total in August having been \$829,700,000. The net result for the province. was a gain of 10.2 p.c. Six of the ten centres in the Prairie Provincec recorded gains. # decline of more than 24 p.c. was shown in Winnipeg, the net result for the economic area being a decline of 18 p.c. Advances were shown in the three clearing centres of British Columbia, Vancouver recording a gain of nearly 15 p.c. The aggregate for British Columbia was 17 p.c. greater.

Comparison with July after Seasonal Adjustment.


Bank debits for the Dominion were \$2,619,000,000 in August against \$2,894,000,000 in July. The decline after seasonal adjustment was limited to 3 p.c. Each of the economic areas recorded slight recessions. The decline in the Maritime provinces was slightly more than 3 p.c. The increase in Quebec was less than normal for the season, the adjusted total being down 0.3 p.c. A slight gain was recorded in Toronto after seasonal adjustment over the preceding month, but the provincial total recorded a decline of 2.6 p.c. The debits of Winnipeg receded 4.2 p.c. after seasonal adjustment, while the total for the Prairie Provinces was down 8.6 p.c. The adjusted debits of British Columbia showed a recession of 8.7 p.c., the Vancouver total being 11.4 p.c. less.

Comparison with the First Eight Months of 1935.

Bank debits in the first eight months of 1936 were \$22,760,000,000 against \$20,259,000,000 in the same period of 1935. The gain of 12.3 p.c. represents the acceleration in business and speculation, each of the economic areas recording increases in this comparison. The Maritime provinces showed a gain of \$40,000,000 or about 11 p.c. The gain in the province of Quebec was substantial, amounting to more than \$1,100,000,000, the increase in Montreal was 20.3 p.c.; the net result for the province being a gain of 19 p.c. Each of the thirteen centres of Ontario, except Ottawa, showed increases for the first eight months of 1935. The gain in Toronto was 7.3 p.c., while the total for the province was up 7.7 p.c. Seven of the ten centres in the Prairie Provinces showed gains for the first eight months of 1935, the aggregate being up 9.8 p.c. Winnipeg recorded an increase of 13.4 p.c., Each of the three centres of British Columbia showed marked gains over the same period of 1935. The gain for the province was 25 p.c. and Vancouver recorded an edvance of 25.3 p.c.

Comparison with Other Economic Factors.

The reasonally adjusted index of bank debits on the base of 1926 was 116.2 in August against 119.8 in July and 110.8 in August of last year. Wholesale prices were considerably higher in August than in the preceding month or in the same month of last year. A slight increase is shown in common stack pricestover the preceding month; the advance from August of last year was about 21 p.c. Trading on the Montreal stock exchange was less active in July. According to preliminary compilation, the index of the physical volume of business was higher in August than in July, a considerable gain having been recorded over August of last year.

CENTRES OF CANADA, AUGUST, 1936, WITH COMPARATIVE




