## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, FEBRUARY, 1938.

The amount of cheques cashed at the branch banks was $\$ 2,176 \mathrm{million}$ in Fobruary, a deoline of $4.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$ from the preceding month, after seasonsl adjutment. The Maritime Provinces and Ontario recorded gains in this comparison, while the other economic areas were lower. The gain in the Maritime Provinces, after adjustment, was sligint, the total in February having been $\$ 45.0$ million. A deoline of 1.3 per cent wes shom in the aggregate for Quebeo, Montreal having been down 1.7 per cent. The showing in Oncario was favourable, a gain of 2 per cent having been reccrdes in the provincial total and an increase of 3.2 per cent in Torontu. The lebits in the Prairie Provinces were at a muoh lower level, the decline after adjustment having been slightly more than 20 per cent. A drop of 14 per cent was show in Winnipeg. The decline in British Columbia was 2 per cent to $\$ 138.5$ million. Vancouver recorded a decline of 3.2 per cent, the total in February having been $\$ 109.9$ million.

Comparison with February, 1937.
Bank debits in Februay were at a much lower level than in the same month of last year, the Dcminion total receding 20.3 per cent. Each of the economic areas recorded declines in this comparison. The drop in the Naritime Provinces was 0.8 per cent. The provincial total for Quebeo was down 23 per cent, a decline of 24.5 per sent having been shown in Montreal. Ottawa recorded an increase of 5.2 per cent, while Toronto was 22 per cent lower. The total for Ontario recorderi a docline of 17.7 per cent. The deoline in the Prairie Provinces was 25.7 per cant, Winnipeg having shown a drop of 34 per cont. The sum of the debits of the three centres in British Columbia reoorded a decline of 22.4 per cent. Vencouver showed a recession of somewhat greater proportions.

Comparison with the First Two Months of 1937.
Bank debits in the thirty-two clearing centres were $\$ 4,621$ million in the first two months of 1938 against $\$ 5,959 \mathrm{million}$ in the same period of the preceding year. Each of the five economic areas recorded declines in this comparison. The drop in the Maritime Provinces was 12.7 p.c., while a decline of 14.3 per cent was recorded in Quebec. The debits in Ontario in the last two months amounted to $\$ 2,220$ million, against $\$ 2,889$ million in the same period of 1937, a drop of more than 23 per cent. The decline in the Prairie Provinces was rearly l9. por cent, while British Columbia showed a drop of 17 per cent. Fifteen of the thirty-two centres recorded increases over the first two months of 1937.

Comparison with Other Factors.
The percentage of bank debits to deposits was 97.6 in February compared with 117.2 in the same month of 1937. The decline in bank debits was 20.3 per cent while the sum of the four classes of deposits dropped off from $\$ 2,330.3$ million to $\$ 2,230.6$ million. The index of bank debits on the base of 1926, after seasonal adjustment, was 97.1 in February against 121.9 in the same month of last year. The index of the physical volume of business was at a somewhat lower point. An advance was shown in wholesale prices, the index increasing from 82.9 to 83.6 , while the index of oormon stook prices declined from 142.4 to 107.1 .
