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BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIIUSL ACCOUNTS, JANUARY, 1939
The dollar volume of business in the form of bank debits recorded a gain in January over the same month of 1938. The total in the first month of the year was $\$ 2,512$ million against $\$ 2,445$ million, an increase of 2.8 p.c. Gains were recorded in each of the five economic areas except the Maritimes and the Prairie Provinces. The decline in the Maritime Provinces was 3.2 p.c., the total having been $\$ 50.9$ million against $\$ 52.6$ million one year ago. The gain in Montreal was 4.1 p.c., the total having been $\$ 737$ million. At $\$ 799$ million the net result for the Province of quebec was a gain of 3.8 p.c. While a majority of the thirteen centres in ontario recorded declines, a gain of nearly 2 p.c. was shown in the provincial total. The debits of Toronto amounted to $\$ 889$ million, a gain of 5.3 p.d.

Despite an increase of 2.4 p.c. In the bank debits of Winnipeg, the total for the Prairie Provinces showed a decline of $0.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total was $\$ 322$ million against $\$ 325$ million. The cheques cashed in British Columbia amounted to $\$ 177.5$ million against $\$ 156.8$ million, an increase of 13.2 p.c. The gain in Vancouver was $17.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the rise having been from $\$ 124.1$ million to $\$ 145.4$ million.

## Comparison with December, 1938, After Seasonal Adjustment

The decline in bank debits from December, after seasonal adjustment, was 3 p.c., the Dominion total having been $\$ 2,512$ million against $\$ 2,906$ million. A slight gain was shown in the total for British Columbia after the usual adjustment, while the four other economic areas recorded decline. The total for the Maritime Provinces dropped from $\$ 58.4$ million to $\$ 50.9$ million, an adjusted decline of 7.2 p.c. While a slight gain was shown in Montreal, the total for the province of wiebec was down 0.4 p.c. Considerable reaction was shown in Ontario from the preceding month, the decline in Toronto having been 15 p.c. while the provincial total was 7.p.c. less.

Debits in Winnipeg were $\$ 177.5$ million against $\$ 250.9$ million in December, a decline of 19.3 p.c. after seasonal adjustment. The percentage decline in the economic area was of lesser proportions, the total having been $\$ 323$ million against $\$ 418$ million. Thile debits in vancouver recorded a recession of 2.2 p.c., the provincial total for British Columbia was practically unchanged.

## Comparison with Other Economic Factors

Bank clearings in January amounted to $\$ 1,377$ million, the percentage of bank debits to bank clearings having been $: 82.4$ compared with 180.0 in the same month of 1938. The sum of the deposit liabilities of the chartered banks showed a slight increase at the boginning of the year. The percentage of bank debits to deposits was 100.5 in January against 104.7 one year ago. Owing to the decline in bank debits during January, the percentage showed a considerable decline from 116.2 , the standing in December. The index of bank debits, after seasonal adjustment, was 104.0 in January against 101.2 in January, 1938, the position in December having been 107.2. Wholesale prices were fully maintained in January at the level of the preceding month. A decline of about four points to 102.9 was shown in the index of common stock prices. According to preliminary calculations, the physical volume of business recorded reaction in January from the standing of 115.6 in the preceding month.
