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## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, APRIL, 1940.

The cheques cashed at the clearing centres of Canada mere nearly $19 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. greater during April than in the same month of 1939. The total pas $\$ 2,938$ nillion against $\$ 2,473$ million in the same month one year ago. Increasos mere rocorded in each of the five economic areas. The gain in the Maritimes was 44.4 p.c., the total having advanced from $\$ 46.4$ million to nearly $\$ 67$ million. The gain in the Province of Quebec mas of more moderate proportions amounting to only $0.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total for Montreal advanced from $\$ 723$ million to $\$ 753$ million, a gain of 4.2 p.c. The increase in Ontario was $17 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. the rise having been from $\$ 1,134 \mathrm{milli}$ on to $\$ 1,328$ million. $\Lambda$ marked increase mas shown in Winnipeg, the gain having been from $\$ 167.8$ million to $\$ 378.9$ million. The aggregate for the Prairie Provinces roso $73 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to $\$ 539.5$ million. The increases in Vancouver and British Columbia mere $16 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $11 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. respectively.

Comperison with March 1940, After Seasonal Adjustment.
Bank debits in Canada during April amounted to $\$ 2,938$ million compared oith $\$ 2,413$ million in March. After seasonal adjustment, the increase was 18.4 p.c. Gains were recorded in each of the cconomic areas, the Maritime Provinces and Quebec showing increases of $7.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $5.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. respectively. The increase in Ontario was computed at 27.5 p.c., the gain in Toronto having been 22.1 p.c. Marked gains mere recorded in Winnipeg and the Prairie Provinces amounting to nearly $44 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in each case. The gain in British Columbia mas 6.6 p.c., while Vancouver shomed an increase of 11.1 p.c.

Comparison with the First Four Months of 1939.
Bank debits during the first four months of 1940 were $\$ 10,981$ milifon against $\$ 9,463$ million in the same period of 1939, a gain of 16 p.c. Increases vere recorded in each of the five economic areas over the same period of 1939. The increase in the Maritime Provinces was $39.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Fach of the three centres in quebec recordod gains, the increase in the aggregate having been 7 p.c. General increases mere recorded in the thirteen centres in Ontario. The gain in Toronto was $3.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while the provincial total rose 12 p.c. A gain of $55 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Mas shown in the Prairie Provinces, the rise in Winnipeg having been nearly $82 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The bank debits of Vancouver were $7.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. greater than in the first four months of 1939, while tho total for the province recorded a gain of $7.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

## Comparison mith Other Factors.

The percentage of bank debits to deposits mas 107.9 in April against 99.3 in the same month of last year. The sum of four classes of deposits rose from $\$ 2,492$ million to $\$ 2,724$ million, while the increase in bank debits was mearly 19 p.c.

The index of bank debits after seasonal adjustment, on the base of 1926, was 123 in April against 103.6 in the same month of 1939. Marked increases were shown in the physical volume of business, omployment and wholesale prices over the same period of last year. The index of common stock prices mas 97.0 against 96.2 in April one year ago.
