BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, JUNE, 1941.

The amount of cheques cashed by branch banks in Canada was at a particularly high level in June reflecting payments for the recent Victory Loan. The total was $\$ 4,241$ million against $\$ 2,682 \mathrm{milli}$ on in the same month last year. The gain of $58 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. was shared by each of the five economic area.

Tho gain in the Maritime Provinces was 54.4 poc. the total rising from $\$ 62$ million to nearly $\$ 96$ million. The gains in Montreal and the province of quebec were 63 p.c. and 57.5 p.c. respectively. Montreal debits rose from $\$ 665$ mililon to $\$ 1,080$ million in the month under review. Each of the 14 centres in Ontario showed gains over the same month one year ago. The gain in Ottawa was $93 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. While Toronto showed a rise of $55 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The aggregate for the provinces was $\$ 2,046$ million against $\$ 1,253 \mathrm{million}$ in June last year. The cheques cashed in St. Catharines unreported for last year were $\$ 21.9$ million in June. Each of the 10 centres in the Prairie Provinces recorded important gains in this comparison. The total was $\$ 650$ million against $\$ 455$ million, a gain of nearly 43 p.c. The rise in British Columbia was 66 p.c. the total in June having been $\$ 275$ miliion.

Comparisonwith the first 6 months of 1940.
The marised increase in bank debits during June had an important effect upon the half yearly total. The amount of cheques cashed in the first half of the present year Was $\$ 18,810$ million against $\$ 17,002$ million in the same period last year. The consequent increase was $\$ 1,808$ million or 10.6 p.c. Each of the five economic areas recorded advances in this respect. Increases were shown in 31 of the 33 centres now reporting. The gain in the Maritime provinces was 12.4 p.c. the total having been $\$ 450$ million against $\$ 400$ million. Montreal and Sherbrooke recorded gains, the total for the province of Quebec having been $\$ 5,221$ million against $\$ 5,071$ million. The increase was $3 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. or nearly $\$ 150$ million. Bank debits for each of the 14 centres in Ontario recorded gains over the seme period of last yesr. Debits in Toronto were $\$ 5,776$ million against $\$ 5,307$ million, a gain of $9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total for the province was $\$ 8,924$ million against $\$ 7.489$ milion, an increase of 19.2 p.c. Each of the 10 centres in the Prairie Provinces except Wianipeg recorded increases over the first half of 1940. The total for the Prairie Provinces was $\$ 3,048$ million compared with $\$ 2,997$ million, a gain of nearly 2 p.c. or $\$ 51$ million. The gain in British Columbia was nearly $12 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. advances heving been shown in each of the 3 clearing centres.

Comparison with May after seamonal adjustment.
The increase in bank debits over May after sensonal adjustment amounted to 42 p.c. in the Dominion total. Appreciable advances were shown in each of the five economic areas. The greatest change was recorded in Ontario. The total moved up from $\$ 1,449$ million to $\$ 2,046$ million, a gain of $44 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The increase in the Maritime Provinces and quebec, after seasonal adjustment, amounted to 34.5 p.c. and 25.8 p.c. respectively. The adjusted total for the Prairie Provinces showed an increase of $6.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. the total having been $\$ 650$ million egainst $\$ 633$ million. The gain in British Columbia was $35 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. an advance of 48.6 p. c. having been show in vancouver.

Comparison with other Factors.
The index of bank debits on the base of 1935 m .39 was 1 l 9.0 against 75.3 in the same month one year ago. The index of the national income on the same base was 130.3 in the preceding month against 119.6 in May of last year. Merked advences were also shown in the index of the physical volume of business and in employment in mamfacturing industries. The index of wholesale prices was 88.5 in Mey against 82.1 in the seme month last year.

Circulating media in the hands of the public was estimated at $\$ 428.6$ million in June against $\$ 303.1$ million one year ago. Deposits rose from $\$ 2,785$ million to $\$ 3.045$ million in the same period. The cash and cheque peyments were estimated at $\$ 5,335$ million in June against $\$ 3,412$ million in June, 1940.
