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BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, JANUARY, 1942.
Bank debits, the amount of cheques cashed in clearing centres, were $\$ 3,231$ milion in January against $\$ 2,941$ million in the same month last year. The consequent gain of 9.8 p.c. represented greater aconomic activity and a higher price level due to the accentuation of the war effort. Advances were recorded in each of the five economic areas, the greatost percentage gain having been shown in the province of quebec. The advance in the Naritime Provinces was $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the total having been $\$ 77.2$ million against $\$ 72.8$ million in the same month last year. Debtes in Quebec moved up from $\$ 780$ million to $\$ 939.8$ million, a gain of 20.4 p.c. The increase in Montreal was from about $\$ 700$ million to $\$ 841$ million.

Each of the centres in Ontario, except Toronto, recorded gains over the first month of last year. The net result was a provincial total of $\$ 1,517$ million against $\$ 1,463$ million. The total for ottawa rose from $\$ 249$ milion to $\$ 342$ million, while the Hamilton total rose from $\$ 81$ million to $\$ 103.6$ million.

A gain of 11.4 p.c. Was shown for the aggregate of the ten centres of the Prairie Provinces, the total moving up from $\$ 449$ million to nearly $\$ 500$ million. Considerable increase was shown in Winnipeg, the total in Jenuary having beem $\$ 285$ million. Advances were recorded in each of the three centres of British Columbia, the total having been $\$ 197$ million against $\$ 177$ million.

## Comparison with December After Seasonal Adjustment. -

Aftor seasonal adjustment the Dominion total of benk debits showed a recession of 1.6 p.c. from the December total. Recessions were shown in each of the five economic areas. The declines in the Maritime Provinces and Quebec ware 8.7 p.c. and 4.3 p.c., respectively. The total for Toronto was 13.1 p.c. lower, while a decline of 1.9 p.c. was shown in the provincial total for Onterio. Declines in Winnipog and the aggregate for the Prairie Provinces were $14.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $10.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., respectively. The debits of British Columbia declined 3.6 p.c. while the total for Vancouver was 8.5 p.c. lower.

## Comparison with Other Factors. -

The debits charged against current account were $\$ 3,105$ million in January against $\$ 3,527$ million in the preceding month. The debits charged against savings account receded to $\$ 125.4$ million from $\$ 159.2$ million. The turnover of current deposits in January consequently was 2.16 times against 2.52 times in December. The savings deposits turnover was 0.75 times against 0.97 times in the same comparison.

Circulating media in the hands of the public, including notes and subsidiary coin, was $\$ 498$ million against $\$ 383$ million in the same month last year. The sum of four classes of bank deposits was $\$ 3,104.5$ million at the beginning of January against $\$ 2,804,7$ on the same date of 1940 . Thus the money supply was $\$ 3,602$ million against $\$ 3,193$ million twelve months before. It is astimated that the cash and cheque payments were $\$ 4,313$ million in January against $\$ 3,836$ million in the same comparison.
