

### BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, APRIL, 1942.

The amount of cheques cashed in the clearing centres of Canada was \$3,733 million in April, a gain of 25 p.c. over the same month of last year. The total for the same month of 1941 was \$2,984 million. The marked advance was due to more active business conditions coupled with a higher level of commodity prices.

Each of the five economic areas recorded notable gains over the same month of last year. The increase in the Maritimes was 16.0 p.c., the total in April having been \$85.6 million. Debits in Montreal rose from \$737 million to \$908 million, the total for the province in April having been in excess of \$1 billion compared with \$821 million in April last year. Ottawa debits were \$500.6 million against \$242 million in April 1941, the advance in Toronto having been from \$851 million to \$1,053 million. The net result for the province of Ontario was an increase from \$1,390 million to \$1,895 million, a gain of no less than 36.3 p.c. The gain in the Prairie Provinces was from \$516 million to \$537 million amounting to 4.1 p.c. The debits in Minnipeg were \$324 million against \$303 million in the same month last year. The advance in British Columbia was 16.8 p.c., the total having been \$214 million against \$183 million. The debits in Vancouver rose from \$143 million to \$172 million.

## Comparison with the First Four Months of 1941.

Bank debits in the first four months of the present year were \$14,034 million against \$11,304 million, an increase of \$2,730 million. Consequently the standing was 24.2 p.c. over the same period of 1941. With one exception, advances were recorded in each of the thirty-one centres for which statistics are available. The increase in the Maritime Provinces was from \$278 million to \$346 million, amounting to 24.4 p.c. The gain in Montreal was 25.8 p.c., the total rising from \$2,776 million to \$3,493 million. The gain in the Province of Quebec was 24.8 p.c., the total in the first four months of the present year having been \$3,899 million. The gain in Ontario was \$1,482 million, the total in the first four months having been \$6,911 million. The increase shown in the 13 clearing centres amounted to 27.3 p.c. The gain of 13.5 p.c. in the Prairie Provinces reflected the change from \$1,764 million last year to \$2,002 million in the period under review. Gains were shown in the three clearing centres of British Columbia, the net result being an increase of 23.4 p.c. The total in the present year was \$876 million against \$710 million, the greatest absolute increase having been registered in Vancouver.

### Comparison with March After Seasonal Adjustment.

Owing to heavy payments on the second Victory Loan, bank debits recorded a decline in April after seasonal adjustment from the high standing of March. Debits in April were \$3,733 million against \$4,177 million in the preceding month. The indicated decline irrespective of seasonal tendencies was about 13 p.c. A minor gain was shown in the Prairie Provinces in this comparison, while the four other economic areas showed decline. The total in the Maritime Provinces was \$5.6 million against \$105.5 million in March. The debits of Quebec dropped from \$1,132 million to \$1,002 million. After seasonal adjustment the debits in Toronto showed decline of 7.2 p.c., while the provincial total for Ontario was down 11.1 p.c. The aggregate for the Prairie Provinces rose from \$529 million to \$537 million. Even after seasonal adjustment the gain was 0.7 p.c. A decline, however, of 6.3 p.c. was shown in Winnipeg after the usual adjustment. The debits of British Columbia were \$214 million in April against \$256 million in the preceding month, the debits of Vancouver dropping from \$211 million to \$172 million.

The Turnover of Current and Savings Accounts.

Debits charged to current accounts including government balances amounted to \$3,569 million in April, The standing of the accounts at the beginning of the month was \$1,755 million the indicated turnover having been 2.03. Debits charged to savings accounts were \$163.9 million. The savings deposits amounted to \$1,549.6 million, the turnover consequently being .106. The turnover of current accounts in March last was 2.60, whereas the turnover of savings was .143.

Circulating media in the hands of the public amounted to \$530 million at the beginning of April against \$408 million on the same dete last year. Notes in the hands of the public rose from \$365 million to \$481 million, while it is estimated that the subsidiary coin in active circulation was \$49 million against \$43 million a year ago. The sum of the four classes of deposits was \$3,304.9 million at the beginning of April against \$2,972 million last year. Notice and provincial government deposits were at a lower position, while demand and Dominion government deposits were at a considerably higher point. Cash and cheque payments were estimated at \$4,984 million in April against \$3,895 million in April of 1941.




