BANK DESITS TO INDIVIUUAL ACCCUHTS, APRIL, 1942.

The amount of cheques cashed in the clearing centres of Canada ras \$3,733 million in hipril, a gain of $25 \mathrm{D} . \mathrm{c}$. over the same month of last year. The total for the same month of 1941 vas 2,934 million. The marked advance was due to more active business conditions compled with a higher level of comodity prices.

Each of the five economic aress recorded notable gains over the same month of last year. The increase in the Naritimes was $16.0 \% . c$. , the total in April. heving beer 5.6 million, Debits in inntral rose from $\$ 737$ million to $\$ 908$ million, the total for the province in April having teen in excess of 11 billion compared with 821 million in April last year. Ottaria debits were $\$ 500.6$ million agsinst 242 million in April 194, the advance in Toronto having been from 851 million to $\$ 1,053$ million. The ncti result for the province of untario was an increase from 1,390 million to "1,895 million, $\varepsilon$ gain of no less than 35.3 p.c. The gain in the Prairie Provinces was from \$ 516 million to $\$ 53^{77}$ million amountin to 4.1 p.c. The debits in \%inniper vere $\$ 324$ million against $\$ 303$ million in the same wenth last year. The advence in British Columbia mes 16.8 p.c., the totsl heving been $\% 14$ million against $\$ 183$ million. The debits in Vancouver rose from $\$ 143$ million to $\$ 17$ million.

## Comparison with the First Four Months of 1941.

Bunk aebits in the first four months of the present fear were 14,034 million ajainst $\$ 11,304$ million, an increase of 7,730 million. Consecuently the standing was 24.2 p.c. over the same period of 1941. .ith one exception, advances were recorded in alch of the thirty-one centres for which statistics are available. The increase in tize Maritime Provinces was from $\$ 278$ million to $\$ 346$ million, amounting to 24.4 p.c. The gain in Montreal was 25.8 p.c., the totel rising from $\$ 2,776$ million to $\$ 3,493$ million. The gain in the Province of quebec was $24.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the total in the first four months of the present year havint been $\$ 3,899$ million. The gain in ontario was $\$ 1,482$ million, the total in the first four nonths having been $\$ 6,911$ million. The increase shown in the 13 clearing centres amountec to $27.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The gain of $13.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the Prairie Provinces reflected the change from ${ }^{2} 1,764$ million last yoar to $\$ 2,002$ million in the perioc under review. Gains were shown in the three clearing centres of British Cclumbia, the net result being an increase of 9.3 .4 p.c. The total in the present year ias $\$ 876$ million against 770 million, the greatest ubsolute increase having been registerec in Verncunver.
Comarison rith itarch After Seasonsl Adustraeri.
owing to heavy payments on the second Victory Loan, hank debits recorded a decline in $A_{\text {r }}$ ril after sessonil adjustmont fram the high standing of March. Debits in April were ${ }^{2} 3,733$ million aeainst $\$ 4,177$ nillion in the prececine month. The indicated ciecline irrespective of seasonal tendencies was about 13 p.c. A minor gain was shown in the Prairle frovinces in this comparison, while the four other economic areas showed decline. The total in the Maritime Provinces was 85.6 million ageinst $\$ 105.5$ million in March. The debits of Euetec dropped from $\$ 1,132$ milifon to $\$ 1,002$ million. After seasonEI adjustaent the debits in Toronto shored decline of $7.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while the provincial total for untario was down Il.1 p.c. The aggregate for the Prairie Provinces rose from * 5.9 million to $\$ 537$ million. Even after seasonai adjustment the gain ras 0.7 p.c. A aecline, however, of 6.3 g.c. was shom in winnipeg efter the usual adjustment. The debits of British Columbia were 2214 million in April against $\$ 256$ million in the preceding month, the debits of Vancouver dropong from $\$ 211$ million to $\$ 172$ million.

## The Turnover of Current and Sovings Accounts.

Debits charged to current accounts including government balances anounted to $\$ 3,569$ million in April. The standing of the accounts at the beginning of the month was $\$ 1,755$ million the indicated turnover having bcen 2.03 . Debits charged to sevings accounts were $\$ 163.9$ rillion. The savings deposits amounted to $\$ 1,549.6$ million, the turnover consecuently being .106. The turnover of current accounts in iharch last was 2.60, whereas the turnover of savings viss .143.

Circulating media in the hand of the public amounted to $\$ 530$ million at the beginning of April against $\$ 408$ miliion on the same dute last year. Notes in the hands of the public rose from $\$ 365$ million to 461 million, while it is estimated that the subsiciary coin in active circulation ves $44 \bar{y}$ million against $\$ 43$ million a year ago. The sum of the four clesces of deposits aras $\$ 3,304.9$ million at the beginning of April against \$2,97之 million last year. Notice and provincial government deposits were at a lower position, while denand and Dominion government derosits were at a considerably higher point. Cash ani cherue payments were estimatca at $\$ 4,984$ inillion in April against 43,895 million in Ajril of 1941 .
