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BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, MAY, 1943.

Expanded by heavy payments on the fourth Victory Loan, bank debits rose to \$5,424 million in May compared with \$3,791 million in the same month last year. The cheques cashed at clearing centres reached a new maximum in Canada's banking history, the increase over the same month of last year having been \$1,633 million or more than 43 p.c. Marked advances were shown in each of the five economic areas, gains being recorded in each of the 33 clearing centres.

Debits in the Maritimes were \$150.6 million against \$91.7 million in May, 1942, a gain of 64.2 p.c. The percentage gain was greater than in any other economic area. The total for Montreal rose from \$953 million to \$1,295 million, and marked increases in Quebec and Sherbrooke contributed to the gain of 34.7 p.c. in the aggregate for the province. The provincial total was \$1,422 million compared with \$1,055 million in the same month last year.

Toronto debits rose from \$915 million to \$1,467 million and marked gains were also shown in Ottawa and Hamilton. The total for the fourteen centres of Ontario was \$2,663 million against \$1,887 million in May last year, a gain of more than 41 p.c. The increase in Winnipeg was 58 p.c., the total in the month under review having been \$498 million. The net result for the ten centres of the economic area was a gain of 55.2 p.c., the total having been nearly \$833 million. Increases were shown in the three centres of British Columbia, the aggregate having been \$356 million against \$220 million, a gain of 61.5 p.c.

Comparison with the First Five Months of 1942.

The high level of bank debits in April and May contributed to the important lead of the first five months of the present year over the same period of 1942. The increase amounted to no less than \$3,293 million or 18.5 p.c. The total in the first five months of the present year was \$21,118 million against \$17,825 million in the same period of 1942. Gains of appreciable proportions were shown in each of the five economic areas. The total for the Maritimes rose from \$438 million to \$506 million, a gain of 15.6 p.c. The total in Quebec was \$6,023 million against \$4,955 million, a gain of \$1,068 million. The greatest absolute increase was shown in Ontario where the advance was from \$8,798 million to \$10,088 million, the gain having been 14.7 p.c. The total for the Prairie Provinces rose \$661 million or 26 p.c., the total in May having been \$3,199 million. Debits in British Columbia were \$1,302 against \$1,097 million, a gain of 18.7 p.c.

Comparison with Other Economic Factors.

An index of bank debits on the base of 1935-39=100 was 183 in May against 127.9 in the same month of last year. The standing in April, with seasonal adjustment, was 156.6. During the last twelve months considerable gains have been shown in the indexes of the physical volume of business and employment in manufacturing. The index of common stock prices was 82.6 in April against 62.0 in May, 1942. Minor advances were shown in the indexes of wholesale prices and of the cost of living during the last twelve months.

Cheques cashed against current accounts amounted to \$5,108 million in May against \$3,912 million in the preceding month. Current and government deposits at the beginning of May were \$2,057 million against \$1,927 million one month before. The turnover of current accounts consequently was 2.48 against 2.03 in the preceding month.

Cheques cashed against notice deposits were \$316 million in May against \$159 million in the preceding month. Between the first of April and the first of May, notice deposits rose from \$1,890 million to \$1,926 million. Notice deposits consequently turned over .164 times in May against .084 times in April.

Circulating modia in the hands of the public, including bank notes and subsidiary coin rose from \$538 million in May last year to \$743 million in the month under review. Deposits at the beginning of the month were \$3,984 million against \$3,262 million on the same date last year. The money supply, including the circulating media and deposit liabilities, rose from \$3,801 million in May last year to \$4,727 million in the latest month, a gain of 24 p.c. The cheque and cash payments were estimated at \$7,427 million in May against \$5,087 million in the preceding month, a gain of about 46 p.c.
