## GGQUES CAHDU WGINSI INDIVIDUI ACOCUNTS，LUGUSTe 1946

Checuas cashed in the clearing centres of Canada were z poc．greater in fugust than in the same month of the preceding year．The totul was $\$ 4,867$ million against $\$ 4,727$ million in 1945 ．Trunsactions in thirty of the thirtyouthree cleerine centres were at a higher ievel．The declines were limited to Kingston，Ottawa and Wimipeg．Lhe aggregate for the liaritime Provinces，quobec and British Columbia showed considerable in－ creuse，while the totals for Onturio und the Frairie Irovinces receded to a lower position．

The increase in the luritime Provinces was nearly 23 p．c．The total fnr Halif＇ax was 24 poc．freuter，the percentage increases in koncton und Saint John having been $25.6 p_{0} c$ ．and $19.1 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$ ．respectively．Each of the three centres in equebec recorded higher levels．The gin in liontreal was $13.6 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$ ．to $\$ 1,383$ million Gains of $34.2 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$ 。 and $8,9 \mathrm{poc}$ ．were show in Sherbrouke and quebec respectively．The recession in the provincial total of cintario was nearly 1 p．c．，the total in dugust having been $\$ 2,020$ million．Each of the fourteen centres except Kingston and Cittawa showed gains in this comparison。 The decline in lttawa was from $\$ 401$ milion to W240 million．A slight recession was show in Kintston．The increase in Toronto was 13.5 p．a．，the total mounting to $\$ 1,338$ million。 The greatest percentage increuse was shown in Brantford where the total rose from \＄18 million to $\$ 23$ million，a ghin of 28.7 poc。 Important porcentage increases were also show in Toronto，Lundon and Sarnia．

The derline in the agcregate for the ten centres in the Prairie Frovinces was ll． $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{cog}_{0}$ ，the total in sugust having been $\$ 80 \mathrm{~L}$ million．Ihte only centre showing a decline was＂innipeg where a drop of 26.7 poc．was shown The gractest percentage increase was recorded in lethbridge，where cheques cashed rose $45.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$ ．Duskatoon recorded un increase of 27.3 p．c．and Prince Wbert a eain of 30.2 po．Increases were gencral in the three clearing centres of British Columbia．The udvance in Vancouver was 15：9 poce to 3321 million Gains of 36.4 poc．and 23.3 poce were shown in Victoria and New Wostminster respectively．

## Comparison with Other Factors

Considerable decline was shom in the index of the physical volume of business in July as compared with the same month of last year．Commor stock prices were at a considerably higher position．Relatively minor advances were shom in wholesale prices and cost of living。 Eaployment in manufact－ uring plants showed a considerable recession，the index on the base of 1926 dropping from 202．7 to 183.3

## The First Eicht Months of 1946

Bank debits in Canada vere $\$ 44,918$ million in the first cight months of this year, a guin of 4.9 p.c. over the same period of 1945 . Increbises were shown in euch of the five economic areas except the Prairio Provinces. Pransactions in British Columbia showed the greatest percentage increase, the total rising from $\$ 2,701$ million to nearly ${ }^{W} 3,466$ saillion. The gain in the Maritime Irovinces was 11.3 p.c., the total in the first eight months having been $\overline{j 1,058 \text { rillion. Cheques cashed in }}$ Quebec rose 20.9 p.o. to 313,520 million. The totul for the first elght months of 1945 was $\$ 12,185$ million. The advance in Ontario was limited to $2.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total in the first part of this year was $\$ 20,171$ million, an increace of 500 filliom, The decine in the Frairle provinces was $8.1 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$, the drop having cean \$304 rillion.


## Lonc-iesm Compuism

The Dominion total for the finst bight months of 1048 was greater than in any similar period on record. The increase over 1929 was 47.2 p.c., 4 gain or 131.3 p.c. huving been show over 1938.

The total for the Nuritime Provinces was ereater than billion during the first eight months for the first time in history. The increase over 1929 and 1938 was $99.5 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. and $154.6 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$, respectively. Cheques cashed in the first eight months in Guebec arnounted to 13,520 niliion. During the sura period of 1929 the amount was $\$ 10,699 \mathrm{millicn}$, while in 1938 the standing was as low as $\$ 6,344$ million. The increase over the sume period in the last full yeur of peace-tine before the second world war was 113 p.c. The Cntario totel was $\$ 20,171$ million showing gains of $62.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $223.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$, over the sime periods of 2929 and 1938 . Cheques cashed in the Prairie Provinces at "\$bilion was less than in either 1944 or 1945. The increase over 1929 was 37.5 p.c., while the advance over 1938 was 174.6 p.c. Miarked guins were shown in British Columbia where the percentage increuses were 74.4 and 186 over 1929 and 1938 respectively.

## Cheques Cashed hgainst Sivings and Current Accounts

Debits aguinst current accounts inciudine Dominion anä Provincial belunces and demand deposits were $\$ 4,566$ million in sugust against $\$ 4,501$ million in the same month last year. The sum of the three classes of deposits receded during the
 increased from 1.78 to 1.84 , the amounts beine established by dividing the bank debits by the deposits. Cheques cashed in suvings accounts were $\$ 300$ million in fugust against 226 milli ion last year, the turnover increasing from .083 to . 088 .

## Money Supply

The money supply consisting ol bank debits subject to cheque, bank notes and coin in the hands of the public rose from $\$ 6,392$ million on July 31st last year to $\{7,097$ million on the same date of 1946. The deposits with the Chirtered Banks and the Bank of Canada rose $12.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the same comparison. The total at the end of July was $\$ 6,046$ million against $\$ 5,364 \mathrm{million}$. The sum of the bank notes and coin in the hands of the public was $\$ 1,051$ million against $\$ 1,028$ million, the gain being limited to 2.3 p.c.
