## CHEQUES CASHED AGAINST INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, AUGUST, 1947

Financial transactions in the form of cheques cashed were 7.6 per cent greater in August than in the same month of last year. Twenty-eight of the thirty-three clearing centres showed advances and the totals for each of the five economic areas rose to higher positions. The advance in the amount of cheques cashed reflected the expansion in productive operations and the increase in commodity prices. Employment and industrial production rose considerably over the levels of last year. The percentage of unemployed receded from 2.9 in August last year to about two in the current period. The advance in wholesale prices was nearly 18 per cent, while the cost of living rose 8.8 per cent. The level of common stock prices was nearly 10 per cent lower than in August last year.

Maritimes - The cheques cashed in the three centres of the Maritime Provinces was slightly greater than in the same month of last year. Advances were shown in Moncton and Saint John, while minor recession was recorded in Halifax.

Quebec - The increase in Quebec was 1.4 per cent despite the minor recession in Montreal. The increase in Quebec was 32.7 per cent, while a slight advance was shown in Sherbrooke. The transactions of this class in Montreal were \$1,362 million compared with \$1,383 million one year ago.

Ontario - Eleven of the fourteen centres in Ontario recorded advances over August of last year. The increase in Ottawa was 5.3 per cent, while Toronto showed a decline of 0.4 per cent. The totals for Sarnia and Windsor were at a somewhat lower position. The greatest percentage increase in the economic area was shown in Kitchener, the comparison having been \$33.2 million against \$24.4 million. In percentage increase, Chatham occupied second position, the total advancing from \$13.2 million to nearly \$18 million. The grand total for Ontario was 2.7 per cent greater than in August of last year.

Prairie Provinces - Each of the centres in the Prairie Provinces recorded gains, the advance in the aggregate having been more than 18 per cent. The total for Winnipeg was 22.6 per cent greater at \$511.8 million. The greatest relative increase of 30.4 per cent was recorded in Regina where the cheques cashed were \$92.9 million.

British Columbia - Each of the three centres in British Columbia showed advances of from 30 to 40 per cent. The advance in Vancouver was outstanding, the amount moving up from \$321 million to \$442 million, a gain of 37.8 per cent.

Comparison with the First Eight Months of 1946 - Cheques cashed in Canada during the first eight months were \$47,770 million, a gain of 6.4 per cent or \$2,872 million. Increases were shown in four of the five economic areas, the exception having been Ontario. Each of the clearing centres except Ottawa and Toronto recorded advances over the same period of last year.

Maritimes - The increase in cheques cashed in the Maritimes was 6.9 per cent. The total was \$1,131 million, a gain of \$73 million over the first eight months of last year. Moncton showed the greatest percentage increase in this comparison.

Quebec - Percentage increases during the first eight months of 1947 were fairly uniform in the three clearing centres of the Province of Quebec. The increase for the aggregate was 12,2 per cent and a similar percentage advance was shown in Montreal. The gains in Quebec and Sherbrooke were of slightly greater proportions.

Ontario - Owing to the decline in the cheques cashed in Ottawa and Toronto, the aggregate for the Province was 2.4 per cent lower in this comparison. The greatest percentage increase was shown in Chatham where the total moved up from \$115 million to \$153 million. In Sudbury the advance was nearly 25 per cent, the total in the elapsed portion of the present year having been \$120 million against \$95.8 million. The recession in Toronto was limited to about 3 per cent. The aggregate for the Province was \$19,675 million compared with \$20,151 million.

Prairie Provinces - Each of the ten centres in the Prairie Provinces showed increases over the first eight months of 1946. The aggregate at \$7,552 million was 12.7 per cent greater than in the same period of 1946. The greatest percentage increase was shown in Medicine Hat, where the total was 26 per cent higher. A gain of 21.8 per cent was shown in Regina. The greatest absolute increase was recorded in Winnipeg where a gain of 11.5 per cent was shown.

British Columbia - A marked gain was shown in Vancouver, the principal centre of British Columbia. The total was \$3,482 million, an increase of nearly 24 per cent. Cheques cashed in the province rose 22.3 per cent, the total in the first eight months having been \$4,239 million.

Long-Term Comparisons - Cheques cashed in Canada during the first eight months were greater than in the same period of any other year. Each of the five economic areas except Ontario also showed record levels in financial transactions of this class. The Canadian total was 56.6 per cent above 1929 and 145.9 per cent greater than in 1938. The largest percentage increase over 1938 was shown in British Columbia where the total was three and one-half times as great. The percentage gain in the Maritimes and in British Columbia over 1929 at 113.3 per cent was relatively greater than in the other economic areas.

Turnover in Current and Savings Accounts - The turnover of current accounts was 2.15 in July compared with 2.01 in the same month of last year. The cheques cashed against current accounts increased from \$5,204 million in July to \$5,745 million. The average of current deposits during the month was \$2,668 million this year against

\$2,586 million. As the advance in the cheques cashed was relatively greater than in the current deposits, an increase was shown in the turnover.

Savings deposits during July were about \$1 billion greater than the current deposits. The cheques cashed against savings accounts were at a much lower level than the transactions against current deposits. The turnover of savings accounts was 0.103 in July against 0.101 during the same month of 1946.

Money Supply - Further increase was shown in the money supply at the end of July, the latest date for which statistics are available. The total was computed at \$7,430 million compared with \$7,097 million last year. The increase in the deposits for the same comparison was 5.2 per cent, the total having risen from \$6,046 million to \$6,358 million. The increase in the notice deposits was 8.2 per cent, while demand deposits were 3.2 per cent less. The net result for the two classes of deposits was an increase of 4.8 per cent.

Deposits of the Dominion Government with the chartered banks showed a considerable increase, while Provincial Government balances were at a lower position. The increase in the two classes of deposits with the Bank of Canada recorded an advance of 17.9 per cent. Bank notes in the hands of the public amounted to \$1,008 million compared with \$989 million in July last year. The total circulating media including notes and coin were moderately greater, an increase of 2 per cent having been shown.




