## CIIPGUE CIZAED GGAINST INDIVIDUAL ANCCUNTS, J, NUCRY, 1948

The cheques cashed in thirty-three clearing centres were 4.4 per cent ereater in Jenuary than in the same month of 1947. Frosperous conditions were continued in the first month of the year, and business transactions of this type were greater than in the same period of any other year. The total was $\$ 6,491$ million compared with $\$ 6,216$ million in January, 1947 and advances were shown in the totals for each of the five economic areas, except fuebec. The greatest percentage increase was recorded in the Prairie Frovinces where each of the ten centres showed advances over the first month of last year. The increase in the total for the area was 24.6 per cent.
$T w o$ of the three clearing centres in the Laritime Provinces showed advences in January over the same month of 1947. Halifax and Koncton recorded an increase in business activity, the advance in moncton having been nearly 13 per cent. The decline in Nontreal was instrumental in reducing the ageregate for the economic area of quebec. The kontreal total receded from $\$ 1,883$ million to $\$ 1,684$ million. The marked increases in cuebec and Sherbrocke were insufficient to counterbalance the decrease in Montreal. The decline for the area was 6.3 per cent, the total in January havine been 1,912 million.

Twelve of the fourteen centres in Cntario recorded advances in this comparison. The exceptions were Toronto end Kingston. Despite the decline in the two centres, the totai for the area recorded en increase of 3.8 per cent. The total for the year was $\$ 2,696$ million compared with $\$ 2,597$ million. The greatest percentage increase cver January, 1947 was shown in indsor where the total was more than one-third greater than in the first month of last year. The percentage decline in Toronto was limited to 2.6, the total in January havine been $\$ 1,826$ million. The increase in Ottawa was 29.5 per cent, while Kingston showed a decline of 8.1 per cent.

The total cheques cashed in the ten centres of the Irairie Frovinces rose from $\$ 917$ million to $\$ 1,143$ million. Marked increases were shown in a large number of centres. The greatest percentage increase of the area mas shom in Fegina, the total having moved by 37 per cent. Advances of 35 per cent end 32 per cent were show in Brandon and Caleary, respectively. The advance in innipeg was noarly 22 per cent, the total in January havine been \#652 million.

Each of the three centres in British Columbia showed advances, the aggregate having been 13.4 per cent above the standing of Jenuary, 1947. The Vancouver total was $\$ 480$ million against about $\$ 436$ million in the same month last year.
IONG TERM COMPRISCIV: Cheques cashed in the first month of this year were greater than the same period of any cther year, the total having been $\$ 6,191$ million. Three of the five economic areas also showed advances over any other similar period. The totel for Quebec vas less than in the first month or 1947, while that for Cntario in January cte was greater than in the month under review. The total for the Frairie Frovinces in the first month of the year was greater than one billion dollars for the first time. The cheques cashed in the Laritime Frovinces and British Columbia also reached a new high position in January compared with the same month of any other year. The advance in British Columbia was exceptional in comparison with 1929 und with 1938. The advance was 138 per cent over 1029 and 280 per cent over the pre-war year. The Frairie Provinces showed an advance of 251.4 per cent over 1938, und the Niar time Provinces had business transactions or this class of about 175 per cent greater thar in 1938.
