## CHEQUES CASHED AGAINST INDIVIDHAL ACCOHNTS, FEBRUARY, 1948

The arnount of cheques cashed was 25,651 milion in February, a deciine of about one per cent from the same month of last year, havances were recorded in twenty-five of the trifty-three clearing centres, and the totals for the Muritimes, Pramie Provinces and Britisn Columbia were greater than in the same month of last year. A gain of 25 per cent was shown in the Maritime Provinces, while the total for the Prairie Pro. vinces was 25 per cent greater. The increase in British Columbia was limited to 4.0 per cent.

Advances were shom in cheques cushed in each of the three clearing centres of the Maritime Provinces, over Febmary of Last year. The greatest percentage increase was show in St. Jokn, where the total rose from $\$ 37$ million to $\$ 59$ million. Owing to the reduced level of the business transactions of this type in Montreal, the aggregate for the province of quebec was 4.3 per cent less than in the same month last year. Considerablo percentage increases were shown in Quebec and Sherbrooke, the total for the province having been 81,693 milion compared with $\$ 1,770$ million in F'ebruary last year.

Eleven of the fourteen centres in Ontario recorded advances in this couparison. Owing to the declinc in attawa, Ioronto and chaiham, the provincial total was 5 per cent less. The greatest percantage increase was shom in Hanilton, where the total. rose irom $\$ 13.5$ rililion to $\$ 140$ milion. The total for Winasor was one-fifth greater than in February last year, the standing having been nearly c9i mijlion. The net


Seven of the tan centres in the prujate provinces recorded gains in this comparison. The total for the mble was 25 per cent at $\$ 808$ million. The greatest percentage increase was stown in Brundon, where a gain of 30 per cent mas recorded. An excellent showing was made by Finnipee and Suskatoon, where un increuse of about 20 per cent was show. The gain in British Columbia was $4 . E$ per cent, Vancouver and New kestminster contributing to the result. A considerable recession was shown in Victoria, where the totul was $\$ 60$ million compared with 88 million last year.

LONG TERM COMPMFISON

Cheques cashea in the first two months of 1948 were greater than in any other similar period in history. The total kac $\$ 12,048$ miliion compared with $\$ 11,81 . \%$ mililon in the preceding year. The increase over 1958 was 161 per cent while the level was 60 per cent greater than in 1929 , when conditions in Canada were part-
iculurly prosperous. Three of the economic areas recorded a new maximum for the first two months of the year, Guekec and Ontario shoving a somewhat lower level than one year ago. The maximum for Ontario was reached in the first two montho of 1946, while the maximum for the province of Guebec was recorded in $194 \%$.

The total for the baritime Provinces pas 154 per cent greater than in the same period of 1929, and was about three times as great as in 1938. The gain in British Columbia, where the total for the first two months exceeded $\mathbb{Z}$ billion for the first time, was 124 per cent over 1929 , and 266 per cent over 1938.

## CUERNT AHD SAYINGS KCCOUGIS

Cheques cashed against current deposits were $\$ 6,100$ million in January corpared with $\$ 5,895$ milition in the same month of 1947. As the current deposits shomed a decline, the turnover rose from 2.01 one year ago, to 2.28 in the first month of this year. An increase was alco shown in the velocity oi notice aeposits.

## RELATON TO OTHEE FACTORS

As stated atove, a minor decline vas show in the checues cashed in February, coripared with the same month of last yeur. The cost of living advanced 17.4 per cent during the sume intervai. Comnon stock prices, on the other hand, receded neariy ? per cent. Two adational factors consiciered in this comection recorded increase during January over the same month of 1947. The index of employment in eight industrics rose 7 per cent, whilc wholesale prices were $28 . \varepsilon$ per cent greuter. Unempioyment, however, was somewhat greater in January than in the same month one year ago.

## RONEY SUPFI, Y

The money supply showed a decline of nearly I per cent at the end of January, compared with the dane date of lass year. The total was $\$ 7,479$ million against $\$ 7,545$ uiliion. The money in the hands of the public, consisting of notes and subsidjary coin, was placed at $\$ 1,094$ million, an increase of 1.3 per cent. The deposits subject to cheçue receded from $\$ 6,466$ miliion to $\$ 6,386$ miliion at the end of January, a decline of 1.2 per cent. Notice deposits rose 8.2 per cent, while current accounts were somewhat lower.
