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## CHEQUES CASHED AGAINST INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, AUGUST, 1948

Business transactions in the form of cheques cashed or otherwise paid, rose to a considerably higher level in August than in the same month of last year, The aggregate was $\$ 5.7$ billion, an increase of no less than 9,6 per cent. Increases were recorded in each of the five economic areas and advances were general in the Maritimes and Quebec. Twenty-seven of the 33 clearing centres recorded a betterment. The relative increase in the Canadian total was greater than in the aggregate for the first eight months.

The three clearing centres of the Maritimes recorded advances ranging from 12 to 18 per cent. The total for the area rose 14 per cent over the standing in August last year.

Cheques cashed in Montreal were $\$ 1.5$ billion, a gain of 12 per cent in the twelvemonth comparison. The increase in the city of Quebec was extraordinary, the total having been nearly one-third greater than in August last year,

Ten of the fourteen centres in Ontario showed gains. The increase in Toronto was 12 percent, the total having been $\$ 1,494$ million. The percentage increase in Chatham was greater than in any other centre of Canada, amounting to 38 per cent A gain of 31.3 per cent was shown in Sarnia. The net result was an increase of 9.3 per cent in the total for the province.

Nine of the ten centres in the Prairie Provinces recorded a greater amount of business payments. Winnipeg showed an increase of 7 per cent, the total in August having been $\$ 549$ million, A marked percentage gain was shown in Lethbridge where the total moved up from $\$ 14,7$ million to $\$ 18,8$ million.

The total for Vancouver receded from the high level of last year. Important gains in New Westminster and Victoria more than counter balanced the recession in the larger city. The total for British Columbia was $\$ 544$ million, compared with $\$ 539$ million.

## Comparison With First Eight Months of 1947

Thirty-one of the thirty-three clearing centres showed advances in the amount of cheques cashed during the first eight months of 1948 over the same period of last year. Four of the five economic areas were at higher levels, a recession having been shown in Quebec. The increases in each of the four economic areas were proportionally greater than in Canada as a whole. The relative position of the four areas was consequently improved during the first eight months of the present year.

The increase in the Maritimes was 11.7 per cent. Three clearing centres recorded advances of more than 10 per cent. The decline in Montreal was limited to 3.3 per cent, but the marked percentage increases in Quebec and Sherbrooke failed to offset the recession in the Montreal total. The amount for the city of Quebec during the first eight months was nearly $\$ 1,6$ billion, an increase of 27 per cent.

Cheques cashed in Ottawa during the first eight months were $\$ 2,300$ million, a decline having been shown from last year. Each of the other 13 centres in the province recorded advances, the gain in the aggregate having been 8.2 per cent. The total for Toronto was 11.3 per cent greater at $\$ 14,5$ billion.

Advances were general among the 10 centres of the Prairie Provinces, the net result for the area being an increase of 10.4 per cent. Cheques cashed in Winnipeg were $\$ 4.7$ billion, a gain of 12.6 per cent.

The three centres of British Columbia showed advances, the gain in the province having been 6.6 per cent. The increase in Vancouver was 5.3 per cent and much greater percentage gains were shown in New Westminster and Victoria.

## Long-Term Comparisons

Cheques cashed in Canada during the first eight months were greater than in any other year. The total was $\$ 50,5$ billion, compared with $\$ 47.8$ billion in 1947 . The gain over 1929, a year of high prosperity, was 65,5 per cent, while the advance over the pre-war year of 1938 was 160 per cent. Four of the five economic areas reached a new maximum during the first eight months. The exception was in Quebec, where the total was $\$ 15,093$ million, compared with $\$ 15,174$ million, the maximum reached in 1947. The increase in British Columbia over 1938 was nearly 273 per cent, while the Maritimes recorded an advance of 138 per cent over 1929 and 204 per cent over 1938.

Current and Savings Accounts
Cheques cashed against current accounts in August last, were $\$ 5.4$ billion, compared with $\$ 4.9$ billion in the same months of 1947. Increases were shown in each of the five economic areas except British Columbia. The total in the province of Quebec was $\$ 1,672$ million compared with $\$ 1,461$ million in August of 1947 , while the current payments in Ontario were $\$ 2,128$ million against $\$ 1,955$ million. An increase was shown in the cheques cashed against savings accounts in August over the same month of 1947. The increase was from $\$ 310$ million to $\$ 347$ million. Gains were shown in each of the five economic areas except the Prairie Provinces. The advance in Ontario was from $\$ 120$ million to $\$ 139$ million while the total for Quebec moved up from $\$ 85$ million to $\$ 97$ million.

The current deposits at the end of July were $\$ 2,764$ million, compared with $\$ 2,668$ million on the same date of 1947 . The turnover rose from 25.84 to 27.50 , the velocity being expressed on an annual footing. The turnover or velocity is obtained by dividing the cheques cashed against current accounts by the current deposits. The turnover of savings deposits was 1.22 on an annual footing, compared with 1.24 in the same month last year, Cheques cashed rose from $\$ 379$ million to $\$ 402$ million and the savings deposits rose during the same interval from $\$ 3,667$ million to $\$ 3,947$ million.

Relation to Other Factors
Cheques cashed rose 9,6 per cent in August, over the same month of 1947. The majority of economic factors considered in this connection recorded advances in the latest month for which the statistics are available over the same month of 1947. The index of Industrial Production based on manufacturing, mining and electric power, showed an advance of 1.9 per cent. The mining index, reflecting a considerable recovery in productive operations, rose 15 per cent over July, 1947. Rubber consumption suggestive of operations in the rubber industry, was 6,3 per cent less. The manufacture of tobacco was more active than in the same month of last year, the release of cigarettes rising 10 per cent. Bale openings by the cotton industry were 13,2 million pounds against 13.0 million in the same month last year. The production of wood pulp in July showed an expansion of nearly 6 per cent, while the output of newsprint in August was 389,000 tons, a gain of 3 per cent. Steel production was 5.4 per cent greater, while automobiles showed considerable decline. The continued activity of the construction industry was shown by the gain of 30 per cent in the value of new business obtained during August.

The increase in production was paralleled by the advance of 4 per cent in employment as of the first of July. Advances were shown in manufactures and mining, Aggregate payrolls in nine leading industrial groups rose sharply by 17.3 per cent. Average weekly earnings were $\$ 40.47$ compared with $\$ 36,20$. The increase in generai wholesale prices was 17 per cent, consumers' goods having advanced 19.8 per cent.
