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## CHEQUES CASHED AGAINST INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, JANUARY, 1949.

The advance in busimess transactions in the form of cheques cashed continued in the first month of the year. The increase over January, 1948 was 6.7 per cent. The total transactions of this type were $\$ 6,929$ million in January against $\$ 6,491$ million. The five economic areas participated in the increase, the greatest percentage gain having been shown in the Maritime Provinces. The advance in the total of the three centres in the Maritimes was 11.5 per cent, a marked increase having been shown in Saint John.

The increase in Montreal was 9.6 per cent, the recession in the city of Quebec tending to retard the advance in the provincial total. The aggregate for the province was 8.4 per cent greater at $\$ 2,073$ million.

Twelve of the 14 centres in Ontario were at higher levels in January, than one year before. The greatest percentage increases were shown in Sudbury and Brantford. The increase in Toronto was 9.7 per cent which may be compared with the increase of 7.8 per cent in the aggregate for the province.

Seven of the ten centres in the Prairie Provinces recorded gains in this comparison, the total for the area having been 3.3 per cent greater. Business transactions in Winnipeg were slightly greater than in January, 1948. A considerable advance was shown in Lethbridge where the level was 40.4 per cent higher

Vancouver and Victoria recorded advances while New Westminster was at a lower level. The gain in the aggregate for the province of British Columbia was 1.8 per cent.

The cheques cashed in the first month of 1949 were greater than in the same month of any other year. The increase over 1929 was 69 per cent while a gain of 183 per cent was shown over 1938. The showing in each of the five economic areas resembled that of Canada as a whole, the standing in the month under review having been greater than in any other January. The increase in British Columbia over 1938 was 287 per cent and the level of 1929 was surpassed by 142 per cent.

Deposit Turnover.
The turnover of current deposits in December, 1948 the last month for which complete statistics are available, was 28.21 compared with 27.92 in the same month of 1947. The current deposits rose from $\$ 2,761$ million to $\$ 3,117$ million while the cheques cashed advanced from $\$ 6.4$ billion to $\$ 7.3$ billion. An increase was also shown in the turnover of notice deposits. The cheques cashed against such accounts rose from $\$ 385$ million to $\$ 474$ million.

## Relation to Other Factors.

Cheques cashed rose from $\$ 6.5$ billion in January, 1948 to $\$ 6.9$ billion in the month under review, the gain having been 6.7 per cent. The rise in wholesale prices was more extensive in the 12 -month period than in the amount of business transactions in the form of cheques cashed. The advance in industrial production in December over the same month of 1947 was only 3.8 per cent. The general inder. of wholesale prices in the same comparison rose 11.1 per cent. Raw and partly manufactured goods were 12.7 per cent greater while an advance of 13.4 per cent was shown in producers' goods. The cost of living in January was 7.6 per cent above the same month of last year.

The increase in the index of industrial production was 3.8 per cent, manufactures having shown a gain of 3.2 per cent while mining rose 11.8 per cent. The increase in employment in nine leading industrial groups in December over the same month of one year before was only 2.4 per cent. Aggregate payrolls in the same sector, on the other hand, were 13.3 per cent greater, average weekly earnings having shown a gain of 10 per cent.
