## Amown pe Oherues Chooran ageinst Bank Acounts at the Ciecrias Hovse ient=es jn TuIV 7926.

Bank debits in JuIy womo werly 8 po. freater than in the corresponding month of either 1925001924 , and exceeded any of the preceding months of tho preson toar oxoopt hpril and June. When correction is made for seasona tendencies, the debits in July were less than in ary othe: montio of the prosent year with the exception of liay. Ths total in July, as reported to the Dominior Bureau of Statistice by tho Canadian Bankois' Association was $\$ 2,424,000,000$, as compared with $\$ 2,248,000,000$ in July 1925, an incroase or $\$ 176,000,000$ or 8 p.c. The debits in July when adjusted for seasonar variation, show a denine of $9 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. from Junc and an incieaso of H poc over lay.

Bank olcarings in July woro \$1,444,014,544, as comparod
 of $9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

Comparison of ino-frst Seven months of 1926 and 1925.
The dobits for the first sevon months of 1926 amountod to $\$ 16,055,002,000$, as sompared with $015,061,000,000$ in the corrosponding periad of 1925, an increase of nearly l3 p.c. Tho groatost gain was atteinod in the province of quoboc, whero the increaso Was 16 p.c.. The aivances in untario and British Columbia were each abous 15 poc. The grin in the Mlaritime Provinces was 13 p.c., Whila the more modomate increase of $4 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. was. shown in the Prairie provincos.

## Comparison by Areaswith July. 1925.

Maitime Provinces.- The considerable increase of $15 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the debits of the lantime provinces was aue to the expansion at Halifa:, where the total in Juiy was $\$ 32,700,000$, as compared with $\$ 26,200,000$ in evuly 1925, an increase of $25 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$.

Quebec.- The debits of liontroal, amounting in July to \%700,700.00 were slighty in ereess of the corresponding month of 1925. Important gains ucce shown at the remaining centres of Quobec and Shorbroore, with tho rosult that tho debits of tho provinco shostod : gain of worc thal 6 p.c.

Antarion- Eight of the elaven centres in ontario for which comnarative statistics aro availablo showed gains in July, doclinos being erporionced as Drantford, ifitchonor and ottawa. The increasos at Tornnto cna Homilton wove $15 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{e}$. and $14 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c} .$, respoctively. Tho incroaso of tho province in this comparison
 with $860,600,000$ in euly 19:5.

Prairig Proviroos:- With tho exception of Branooss
 out the Prajris Provinces. Phe porin in Tinninee wns 10 poo.g

 for the three provinoes was an inurease of 8 pec.

British Colmmia.- Declines wero oxporioncod in
Vancouvor ald Victariz, rosulting in a decrouso 0 \% 3 pece in tho dobits of tho provinco. Tho dabits of Vancoutor woro出129,200,000, as comparod with $133,200,000$ in July 1925, a doclino of 3 p.c.

## Comparison with Juno 1926 with Corroction for Sonsonal Variation.

Ermproring tho adjustod dobits of July with tho procoding montig inoratsea Wero shown by the two large wostern contros. Whinc substantial doclinos aceurrod at hontroal and Toronto. Winnipog showod tho larevat guin of nearly 5 p.co whila tho incrasso at Vancouvar was i p.c. Tho

 ing housc oentres of tho Domiaion as a wholo wes 9 p .c.

## Comparison of Bank Clearings and Eank Iobzts.

Tho futility of using bank cloarings to pootray the dollar volumo of businoss in Canadn, espocially in long torm compariscus, is dononstratod by ting incrocasing aycosa of dobits ovoro oloarings, as tho josult of bank anciffimations. If tho cumulativo totals for the finst sovon monthe of oach of the last throc yoars aro compared, it is found tuiat tho polecntaso of bank dobits to bank clecrings in the first soton months of 1926 was 173.7 p .c., as comparod \#ith 169.1 p.c. in 1925 and $158.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in 1924.
