BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS

OF

Amount of cheques charged against Bank Accounts at the Clearing House Centres,  
December, 1927

A new high point was attained during December in the dollar volume of Canadian business, the bank debits exceeding the previous maximum attained in November. The increase in debits over the preceding month was 3 p.c. and this percentage would be more than doubled if adjustment were made for seasonal tendencies. Debits are normally 4.5 p.c. less in December than in November. Consequently the increase between November and December, after adjustment, would be about 7.5 p.c.

The increase in bank debits over December 1926 was 50.4 p.c., the total as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Canadian Bankers' Association being \$4,274,000,000. This amount may be compared with \$2,843,000,000 in December 1926, and \$4,151,000,000 in November last. Bank clearings were \$2,381,000,000 in December, as compared with \$1,746,000,000 in the same month of 1926, an increase of 36.4 p.c.

Total Debits for the Year.

The total bank debits of the clearing house centres throughout the Dominion were \$36,094,000,000 in 1927, representing an increase of \$5,735,000,000 or nearly 19 p.c. over 1926. The increases over 1924 and 1925 were 33 p.c. and 28 p.c., respectively. While increases were shown in each of the economic areas in 1927 as compared with 1926, the greater part of the gain was in Quebec and Ontario, where the increases were 27.6 p.c. and 22 p.c. respectively. The increase in the three centres of the Maritime provinces was 3.8 p.c.; and increase of 4 p.c. was shown in the Prairie provinces, while a slightly greater gain of 4.8 p.c. occurred in British Columbia.

Comparison with November after Seasonal Adjustment

Based on the experience with bank clearings in the twelve-year period 1913-1924, an adjustment of the statistics of bank debits was effected for the purpose of facilitating short term comparisons. Comparing the adjusted debits of December with those of the preceding month, the Canadian total showed an increase of 7.5 p.c. On the basis of indexes of seasonal variation computed for each of the four large centres, Vancouver showed the largest increase of 12 p.c. The gain in Toronto was 6.5 p.c., and an increase of a like percentage was attained in Montreal. Winnipeg showed a gain of 1.6 p.c.

Comparison by areas with December 1926

Large increases were shown in each of the economic areas except British Columbia, where the gain was relatively moderate.

Maritime Provinces.— Each of the centres in the Maritime Provinces showed increases, the net result being a gain of 26 p.c.

Quebec.— The gain in Montreal was no less than 78.5 p.c., the total reaching the unprecedented figure of \$1,471,194,644, and increases were also shown at Quebec city and Sherbrooke. The debits in Quebec Provinces were \$1,561,000,000, an increase of 73 p.c.

Ontario.— Each of the 12 centres in Ontario recorded gains in December as compared with the same month in 1926, the increase in Toronto being 50 p.c. to \$1,182,744,933. The total debits in the province were \$1,712,000,000, an increase of 51 p.c.

Prairie Provinces.— Ten centres in the Prairie Provinces showed increases, while the debits of the branches of the Weyburn Security Bank experienced a slight decline. The debits in Winnipeg, as well as in the combined centres of the three provinces, showed an increase of 30.5 p.c.

British Columbia.— The increase in Victoria was 24 p.c. as compared with a gain of 3 p.c. in Vancouver. The debits in the three centres of British Columbia showed an increase of 6 p.c.





Comparison with Other Factors

The index of the physical volume of business showed a considerable rally in December, although some manufacturing industries were operating at a low percentage of capacity. Industrial employment was at a high level after adjustment for seasonal tendencies. Trading on the Montreal exchange reached a new high level in December, and active trading on the mining and stock exchanges explains in part the unprecedented totals of bank debits in recent months.

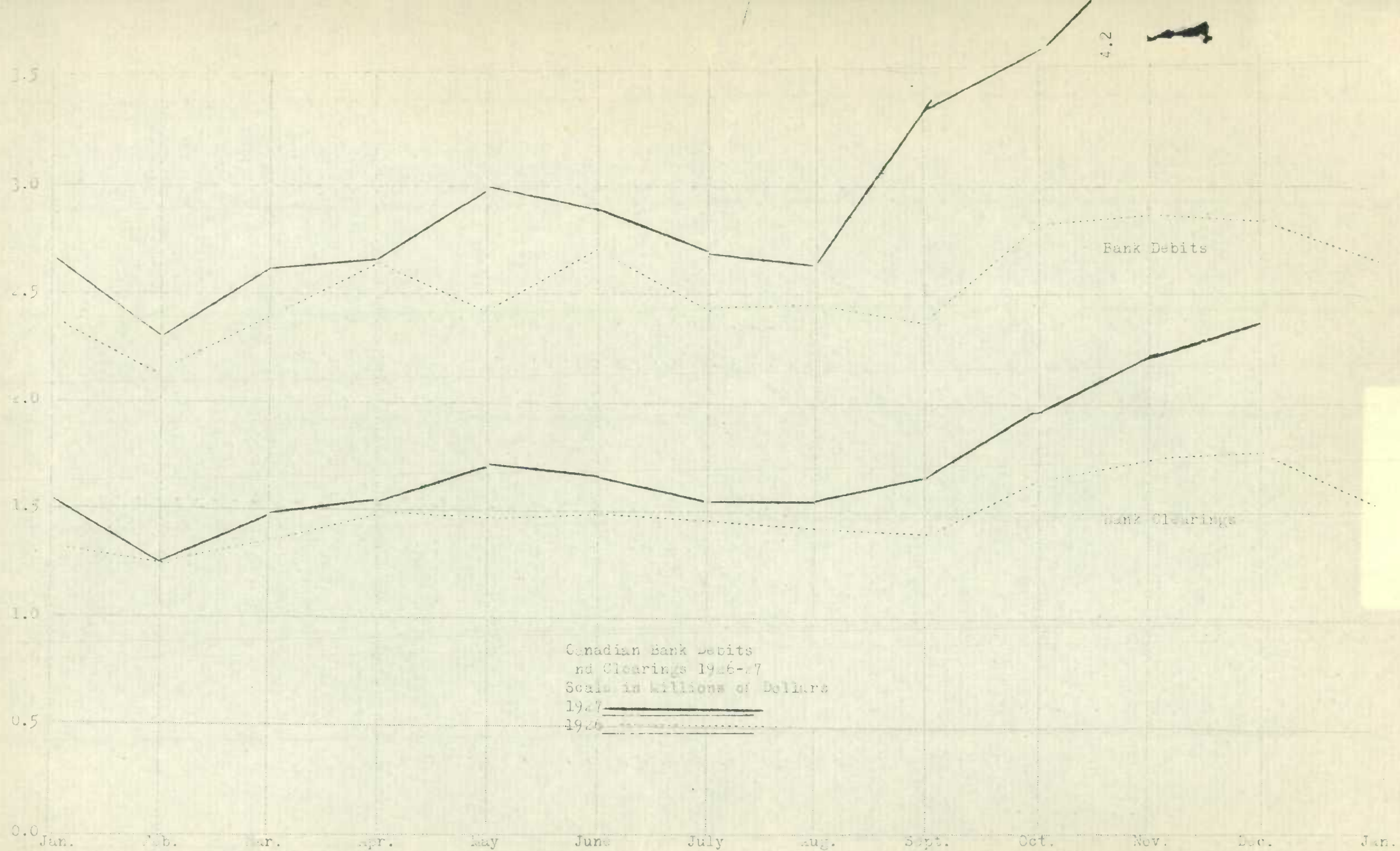
