Bank debits in Canada during June 1928 were 35 p.c. greater than in the same month last year. The total for June, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Canadian Bankers' Association, was $\$ 3,881,000,000$ compared with $62,880,000,000$ in June 1927. Stimulated by active business and speculation, bank debits during the first half of the present year were 32 p.c. greater than in the corresponding months of 1927. The cumulative total for 1928 was $221,226,000,000$, compared with $616,018,000$, 000 and $14,540,000,000$ in the first six months of 1927 and 1926 respectively.

Bank clearings in June were $2,067,000,000$ compared with $1,655,000,000$ in the same month last year, an increase of $25 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The proposed amalgamation of the Standard Bank with the Canadian Bank of Commerce will further vitiate the bank clearings statistics as a guide to the trend of Canadian business activity.

Cumulative Bank Debits in the First Fialf of 1928
Each of the economic areas showed important gains in the cumulative totals for the first half of the present year. In quebec the increase over the first half of 1927 was 37.5 p.c., reflecting the recent unprecedented business and speculative ctivity. Business expansion in Ontario was also pronounced, the gain in debits being 27 p.c. The debits in the Prairie Frovinces in the first six months of 1928 were 3,444,000,000 compared with $2,567,000,000$ in the same period of 1927, an increase of 34 p.c. In Eritish Columbia, the gain in this comparison was 27.5 p.c., while an increase of $25 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Was shown in the Waritime Provinces. (See Table 2)

## Comparison of Bank Debits by Areas with June, 1927

Maritime Provincos. - Marked increases in the three clearing centres of the Waritime provinces indicate a revival in business conditions since last year. The aggregate increase in debits was more than 26 p.c.

Quebec. - The gain in dubits in Nontreal amountad to $3<\mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and increases were also shown at quebec city and Sherbrooke. The increase in the provincial total was 30 p.c.

Ontario. - Increases were shown in each of the twelve clearing centres of Ontario with the xception of Chatham. The increase in Toronto was nearly 38 p.c., and a gain of $37 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. was shown in the province.

Prairie Provinces.- Increases were general in the clearing centres of the Prairie Provinces. The debits in winnipeg were $440,000,000$, an increase of $53 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The net result for the three provinces was in increase of $49 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$.

British Columbia. - The increase in British Columbia was 19 p.c., the gain in Vancouver being 22 p.c. (See Table 1)

Comparison with lay, 1928, After Seasonal Adjustment
The comparison with May last shows unsatisfactory results, owing to the fact that debits in May, after seasonal adjustment, were the greatest since the record was first compiled in January, 1924. After seasonal adjustment, debits in Canada during June were 3 p.c. less than in May. Nontreal showed a deciine of 7.5 p.c. and Toronto a drup of 3 p.c. Winnipeg and Vancouver showed declines of 4.8 p.c. and 2 p.c. respectively.

## Comparison with Other Factors

Wost indexes of the trend of business and of speculation showed recession in June compared with the preceding month. An exception was industrial employment, which again showed a gain at the first of July. The physical volume of business, speculative trading and bank debits showed declines from the high totals of the preceding month. (See Table 5)
