BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS

Amount of cheques charged against Bank Accounts at the Clearing House Centres, July, 1928

Bank debits were nearly 30 per cent greater in July than in the same month last year. The total, reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Canadian Bankers' Association, was \$3,482,000,000 compared with \$2,687,000,000 in July, 1927. Increases of 20 p.c. or more were shown in each of the economic areas over the same month last year. The comparison with June was not so favourable, as after seasonal adjustment a decline of about 9 p.c. was shown. The only large city to show an increase over June was Winnipeg where after seasonal adjustment, the increase was 33 p.c.

Despite curtailment in debits compared with preceding months, the comparison of the cumulative total for the first seven months with the same period of 1927 is decidedly favourable. The increase in the Dominion total was nearly 32 p.c. Bank debits are greatly affected by the course of speculative trading and the active trading in stocks on the Canadian exchanges during the first six months accounts in part for the high level of bank debits. Through credit restriction, speculative dealings declined sharply in July, resulting in the relatively lower bank debits in the month under consideration. Business operations were generally at a high level in the first part of 1923, helping to raise debits to unprecedented amounts during the period.

Bank clearings were \$1,973,000,000 in July, an increase of 28 p.c. over the same month last year.

Comparison of Bank Debits by Areas with July, 1927

Maritime Provinces. - Bank debits in the Maritime Provinces were \$67,700,000 in July, an increase of 21 p.c. over the same month last year.

Quebec. The increase in Montreal was 27 p.c., the total in July last being \$1,108,000,000. Increases were also shown in Quebec city and Sherbrooke, resulting in a gain of about 25 p.c. in the three centres of the Province.


Ontario. Gains were shown in eleven of the twelve centres in Ontario, the increase in Toronto being 34 p.c. The total in the province was \$1,313,000,000, an increase of 28 p.c.

Prairie Provinces. - Bank debits in Winnipeg were \$496,700,000, an increase of 64 p.c. Ten centres in the Prairie Provinces showed increases, the total for the area being \$706,000,000, an increase of 47 p.c.

British Columbia. The total for British Columbia was \$199,000,000, an increase of 20 p.c. over July of last year. The increase in Vancouver was 25 p.c. while substantial gains were shown at New Westminster and Victoria.


Comparisons with Other Factors.

Industrial employment was at a new high point on the first of August. Other factors considered in this connection showed recession in July. Speculation was less active and the general level of business operations was somewhat lower than in June.




