## Anount of cheaues charfed arainsi Benk Accounts at the Clearine Fouse Centres, Julv, 1928

Bank debits were ncarly 30 per cent greater in July than in the same nonth last ycar. The total, reported tc the Iominion Bureau of Statistics by the Canadian Bankers' Association, was \$3,48c,000,000 comparec witiz \$2,587,000,000 in July, 1927. Increases of $20 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. or more mere shomil in each of the economic areas over the sane monch last year. The comparisoi rith Junc was not so favourable, as after seasonal adjustnent a decline of about 9 p.c. was shown. The only large city to show an increase over June mas Winioeg vincre after seasonal adjustment, the increase was $33 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

Despite curteilment ia Gebits compared with preceding montis, the comparison of the cumuletive total for the first seven months with the same period of 1927 is decidedly favourable. The increase in the Dominion total was nearly 32 p.c. Bank debits are greatly affected by the course of speculative trading and the active trading in stocks on the Canadian exchanges during the first six months accounts in part for the hich level of bank debits. Through credit restriction, speculative dealings declined sherply in July, resulting in the relativelylower bank debits in the month under consideration. Business operations mere gemerally at a high level in the first part or 1928 , helpine to raise debits to unprecedented amounts during the period.

Bank clearings were $\$ 1,973,000,000$ in July, an increase of $28 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. over the semo nonth last year.

## Cormparison of Bank ol uits bv Areas with July, 1927

Meritime Provinces.- Benk debits in the Maritime Provinces were \$67,700,000 in July, an increase of 21 p.c. over the same month last year.

Quebec. - The increase in Nontreal was 27 p.c., the total in July last being ;1,108,000,000. Increases mere also shown in Quejec city and Sherbrooke, resultine in a gain of about $25 \mathrm{P} . \mathrm{c}$. in the three centres of the Province.

Ontario.- Gains चere sinown in eleven of the trelve centres in Ontario, the increase in Toronto being 34 p.c. The total in the province vas $\$ 1,313,000,000$, an increase of $23 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

Prairie Provinces.- Bainc debits in Winnipeg Tere $\$ 496,700,000$, an increase $0104 \mathrm{j} . \mathrm{c}$. Tea centres in the Prairie Provinces showed increases, the total for infe ar ea being $\$ 706,000,000$, an increase of 47 p.c.

British Coluribi... Tise total for British Columbia was \$199,000,000, an increase of 20 p.c. over July of last yer. The increase in Vancouver was $25 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. जhile substanticl gains were snown at Ver Testminster and Victoria.

## Comparisons with Other Factors.

Industrial employment aes at a new high point on the first of August. Other fetors considored in this connection showed recession in July. Speculation was less active and the general level of business operations was somenhet lower than in June.
