Bank debits at the clearing house cities of Canada were nearly 25 p.c. greater in August than in the same month of last year. The total reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Canadian Bankers' Association was $\$ 3,243,000,000$, compared with $\$ 2,607,000,000$ in the same month of last year. The greatest percentage increase in this comparison was in quebec, where the gain was no less than 31 p.c. An excellent showing was also made in the Prairie Provinces, with an increase of 30 p.c. Increases ranging from $17 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to $19 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Were shown in the remaining areas.

After seasonal adjustment, the comparison with July last was not so favourable, debits for the Dominion as a whole being nearly maintained only. Moderate increases were shown in Montreal, Toronto and Vancouver. On the other hard, the decline in Winnipeg was about 9 p.c.

Active conditions both in business and speculation have resulted in a new record in bank debits during the first eight months of the present year. The aggregate increase over the same period of last year was nearly 31 p.c. In this comparison, the Maritime Provinces showed an increase of $23 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while Quebec debits were $35 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. larger than last year. The 12 centres of ontario showed an increaso of 26 p.c. An increase of $35 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. indicates progress in the Prairie Provinces. The gain in British Columbia amounted to 25 p.c.

As already stated, the index of bank debits, after seasonal adjustment, was not quite maintained in August as compared with July. The index of employment, similarly adjusted for seasonal variations, showed no change. On the other hand. indexes of the physical volume of business and of speculative activity vere somewhat higher in August.

## Comparison of Bank Debits by Areas and Cities with August, 1927

Bank debits at the three clearing house centres in the Maritime Provinces in August totalled $\$ 60,600,000$, compared with $\$ 51,700,000$ in the same month last year, an incruase of $17 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

The gain in the three centres of Quebec was $31 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., or from $\$ 858,000,000$ to $\$ 1,126,000,000$, the debits in Montreal reaching $\$ 1,049,000,000$, as compared $\begin{aligned} & \text { vith }\end{aligned}$ $\$ 786,000,000$ in August, 1927, an increase of 33 p.c.

The bank debits of Ontario amounted to $\$ 1,220,000,000$ as compared with $\$ 1,035,000,000$ in August 1927, an increase of $18 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Kingston alone, of the 12 centres of the Province, shoved a decline in this comparison; the increase in Toronto was from $\$ 737,000,000$ to $\$ 876,000,000$, or 19 p.c.

Each of the centres in the Prairie Provinces reported increases in August, the net result being a gain of $30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , or from $\$ 492,000,000$ to $\$ 634,000,000$. The debits of \#innipeg showed a gain of nearly $25 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. . or from $\$ 311,000,000$ to \$388,000,000.

British Columbia, with tiree clearing house centres, reported bank debits of $\mathbf{~ 2 0 1 , 6 0 0 , 0 0 0}$ as compared with $\$ 169,500,000$ - an increase of 19 p.c. Vancouver debits were $\$ 159,600,000$ as compared with $\$ 132,800,000$ or a gain of 20 p.c., while incruases were also shown at Victoria and New Vestminstor.
